**I. Regular Items (New, Transfers, Expansions and Hardships):**

1. ~~Johanna Stenberg and Ziad Maalouf, 816 Cathedral, LCC, T/a Café Fili, 816 Cathedral Street~~ – Class “B” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Application for a new Class “B” Beer, Wine and Liquor restaurant license under the provisions of Alcoholic Beverages Article §12-1603(C)(II) requiring \$200,000 in capital investment in restaurant fixtures and facilities and seating capacity for a minimum of 75 people; and request for outdoor table service. **POSTPONED**
2. **Peter Chung and Michael Luke, Shin Dae Gae, Inc., T/a Smitty’s Liquors, 1044 S. Charles Street** – Class “A” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Application to transfer ownership.
3. ~~John Chenery and Alesia Chenery, JR’s Bar & Grill, Inc., T/a Trade Name Pending, 1229 Hull Street~~ – Class “BD7” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Application to transfer ownership, and continuation of live entertainment. **POSTPONED**
4. **Jinguang (Jack) Wang and Jean-Helen Elizabeth Robertson, J G Liquors, Inc., T/a Federal Liquors, 1537 N. Washington Street** – Class “A” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Application to transfer ownership.
5. **Satinder Pal Singh and Raymond Blaylock, NAVRAJ, Inc., T/a Chesley Liquors, 6902-02A Harford Road** – Class “A” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Application to transfer ownership.
6. **Orla Kane and Zeynep Tasdemir, 336 Charles, LLC, T/a Homeslyce, 336 N. Charles Street** – Class “B” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Request to add outdoor table service, and expand premise to include 334 N. Charles Street for business.

**II. Violations:**

1. **Gurpreet Singh, G & S 3724, LLC, T/a Main Street Bar & Liquors, 3724 Eastern Avenue** – Class “BD7” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – **Violation of Rule 4.01(a) Sales to Minors – September 24, 2016** – At approximately 12:30 am, Inspector John Chrissomallis was advised by Baltimore City Police Detective Abraham Gatto to respond to the location to perform an inspection

of the establishment in conjunction with the Vice Unit of the Baltimore City Police Department. Upon arrival Chrissomallis made observations in the manner in which the establishment's security identified patrons 21 and over as they attempted to enter the location. Specifically, Chrissomallis noted one instance wherein three (3) individuals, who all appeared to be under the age of 21, entered the establishment and only one of the individuals presented identification to security personnel. The BLLC inspector noted that the two members of this group who did not present identification before entering were able to purchase alcoholic beverages – notably a bucket of Corona beer bottles - from the bar's personnel. Upon returning to their seats, Det. Gatto and Inspector Chrissomallis approached these individuals. At that time Det. Gatto was able to identify the purchaser of the alcoholic beverages as an individual under 21 years of age. Det. Gatto and Inspector Chrissomallis then asked the other individual for her identification. She stated that it was in her vehicle parked right outside and she would obtain it and then present it to them. This individual then left the establishment and fled the scene. At that time, the bar manager was notified that personnel had just served a minor and that the violation would be reported.

2. ~~**Shannon Glanville and Lores Glanville, Glanville, Inc., T/a Savanna's Island Bar & Grill, 4017-19 Eastern Avenue – Class "BD7" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 3.12 General Welfare – October 2, 2016**~~ – At approximately 1:23 AM Baltimore City Police Officer Tiffany Vlard responded to the establishment for a report of an aggravated assault. Upon arrival, Officer Vlard spoke with security personnel Donte Taylor who explained that at approximately 1:18 am there had been a physical altercation within the establishment. Taylor stated that he attempted to stop the altercation verbally with no success. At that time he then sprayed mace on the dancefloor toward the ground in an effort to disperse the crowd. The effects of the mace helped to move the patrons out of the club. While on scene Officer Vlard noticed that one of the establishment's patrons was experiencing an asthma attack after inhaling the fumes of the mace. The patron was transported to Bayview Hospital for attention. **POSTPONED**
3. **Frawing Galan, Euphoria Restaurant and Nightclub, LLC, T/a Euphoria Restaurant and Nightclub, 1301 S. Ponca Street**– Class "BD7" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – **Violation of Rule 3.12 General Welfare – September 5, 2016** – At approximately 6:00 pm, BLLC Assistant Chief Inspector Tom Karanikolis and Inspector John Chrissomallis performed a special investigation of the establishment as a result of an advertised "Day Party." At approximately 7:45 pm, while on location, BLLC officials observed that the establishment closed and patrons exited en masse onto the 1300 block of Ponca Street. The crowd was so large that O'Donnell and Boston Streets, which bookend Ponca Street on the north and south ends respectively, were not accessible to the public due to patrons standing in the street. Vehicular and pedestrian traffic were so concentrated on the 1300 block of Ponca Street that police and fire resources responded to location to ensure the that the crowd was dispersed in a safe and orderly manner. The immediate area near the establishment was not cleared until approximately 9 pm. At that time, BLLC officials spoke with the licensee/manager of the establishment and informed him of the violation.
4. **Andrew Farantos, G & A Restaurant, Inc., T/a G & A Restaurant, 3802 Eastern Avenue** – Class "B" Beer & Wine License – **Violation of Rule 4.08(a) Relations with Wholesalers – September 2, 2016** – At approximately 1:00 PM, BLLC Inspector Andy Perez conducted a follow-up inspection at the location to review the establishment's alcoholic beverage invoices. On a prior visit – August 5, 2016 – Perez requested from the licensee (Mr. Andrew Farantos) copies of his alcoholic invoices for the alcoholic beverages on location. At that time, Mr. Farantos could not

produce the documents. Upon returning to the establishment on September 2, 2016, Perez again requested the alcoholic beverage invoices for the alcoholic beverages on location. Mr. Farantos could not produce any invoices. When Perez asked Mr. Farantos where he purchased the alcoholic beverages for sale in his establishment, Mr. Farantos stated that he purchased the alcoholic beverages from a retail location. At this time, Perez informed the licensee that a violation would be issued for purchasing alcoholic beverages from a retail establishment instead of from a licensed wholesaler or distributor.

**Violation of Rule 4.16 Illegal Conduct – October 23, 2016** – During inspections conducted on both August 5, 2016 and September 2, 2016, BLLC Inspector Andy Perez requested from the licensee a copy of the current trader's license issued to the establishment. On both occasions, the licensee could not provide a copy of the trader's license. At approximately 1:44 pm on October 23, 2016, BLLC staff conducted a review and determined that a 2016-2017 trader's license had not yet been issued to the establishment.
