Upon arrival, Officer Pittam of the Baltimore Police Department observed three individuals that had sustained gunshot wounds. Victim #1 sustained a gunshot wound to the head. Victim #2 sustained a gunshot wound to the right side of the face. Victim #3 sustained a gunshot wound to the left foot. Further investigation revealed that the suspects who allegedly committed the acts were seated at bar area within the establishment and without provocation approached the victims and proceeded to shoot them.

Violation of Rule 4.16 Illegal Conduct- February 18, 2016 – At approximately 9:58 am, the BLLC reviewed the State Department of Assessment and Taxation (SDAT) on-line records and determined that the corporate status of the entity that owns the license for the establishment – Juan Portillo, LLC – had been forfeited as of 10/1/2015. As of February 18, 2016 the entity’s corporate status is still forfeited.

4. **William Matricciani, Donna Matricciani & George Divel, III, Weidog, LLC T/a Playbook, 6700 German Hill Road – Class “BD7” Beer, Wine & Liquor License- Violation of Rule 4.16 Illegal Conduct- January 17, 2016** – At approximately 1:10 am, the Baltimore City Fire Department and BLLC conducted an investigation into the establishment. Upon entering the establishment, Inspector Hine of the Baltimore City Fire Department observed the following: (1) Three (3) marked fire exits had been concealed by curtains; and (2) The fire alarm panel was off-line and silenced; and (3) The pull station for the fire-alarm was not operable nor was it reset to be made operable. A “Cease and Desist” order was then issued by Inspector Hine until the alarm was in working order. Inspector Chrissomallis was present during Inspector Hine’s investigation. Pursuant to the Fire Department’s investigation and the three citations that the Fire Department issued as a result of the investigation the establishment was closed out of concern for public safety. Inspector Chrissomallis informed the manager of the violations and left the scene accordingly.

Upon making this observation, the Baltimore Police and BLLC notified the night manager on duty.

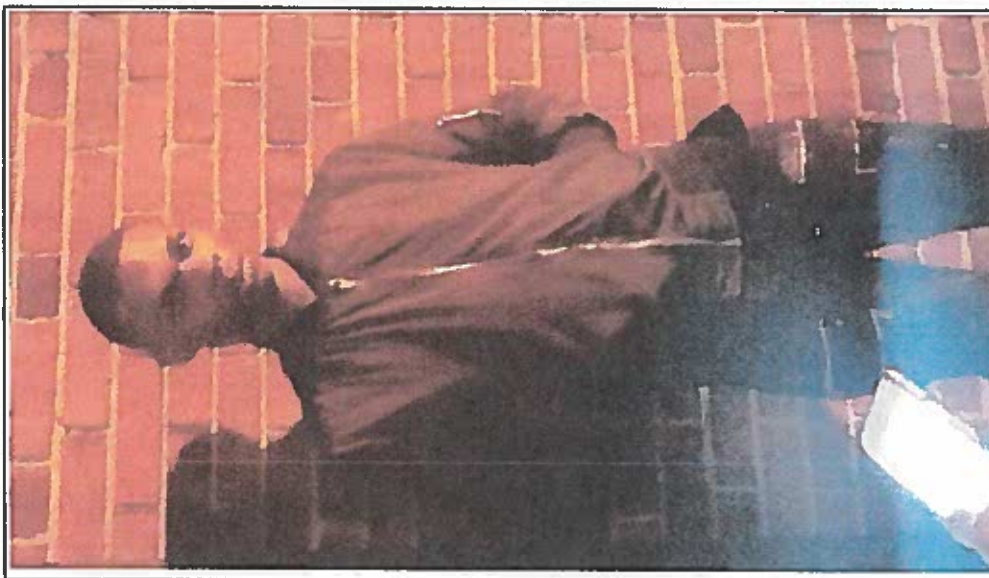

Report Facts:

On January 28, 2016 the Combating Underage Drinking (CUD) task force sent the Liquor Board promotional material for "college night" at various venues. On January 28, 2016 Acting Chief Inspector Howard and Inspector Clark monitored the event at the Bamboo Club, 229 N. Franklinton Road. On January 29, 2016 Acting Assistant Chief Fosler and Inspector Chrissomallis went to the Bamboo Club that venue was closed. Inspector Chrissomallis searched the various websites and found the event had been moved to Paparazzi aka Pulse, 407 E. Saratoga Street. I forwarded this info to the previously involved district commanders and the vice unit. On January 29, 2016 at approximately 11:30pm we arrived at Paparazzi. We observed approximately 400 patrons inside the establishment. When we asked no one was able to provide us with an actual patron count. We noticed there were approximately 5 hooka pipes in use inside the establishment. On January 30, 2016 at approximately 12:00am Detective Greenhill and Detective Gatto arrived at Paparazzi. We worked our way through the establishment observing patrons with alcohol. Patrons 21 and older had a fluorescent green wrist band. At approximately 12:15am bartenders began to remove alcohol from the bar and there were no further alcohol sales. At approximately 12:25am Inspector Chrissomallis and Detective Gatto observed a young African-American male vomiting inside the rear of the club on the elevated balcony. This patron, Everett Mareeno Hardy, DOB 01/31/97 needed to be helped outside by club security accompanied by Gatto and Chrissomallis. His brother also accompanied him. His brother stated that Everett Hardy was served alcohol inside the club. I spoke to Everett Hardy and asked if he could identify the bartender who served him. Mr. Hardy said he could not identify the bartender. While speaking with Mr. Hardy he had a strong smell of alcohol about him and was unsteady on his feet. I advised the manager of the violation and we departed at approximately 1:10am.

Medic #23 transported victim #2: Doe, John (H/M DOB: UNK) to Shock Trauma to be treated, and is in critical condition. Medic #20 arrived on scene, but victim #3, Torres, Oscar, A (H/M DOB: 07/04/1995) refused medical attention, and did not want to be transported to the hospital.

Upon review of the police statement it indicates additional issues with this establishment the night of the shooting it seems that the establishment also should be charge in addition to

Violation of Rule 3.12 "Licensees shall operate their establishments in such a manner as to avoid disturbing the peace, safety, health, quiet and general welfare of the community"

They should charged with: **Violation of Rule 4.01(a)** "No licensee shall sell or furnish alcoholic beverages to any person under twenty-one (21) years of age or to any person with the knowledge that such person is purchasing or acquiring such beverages for consumption by any person under twenty-one (21) years of age"

The police report indicates that two of the victims where under the age of 21 and that the shootings were due to a dispute that occurred inside the bar. I have highlighted the key phrases that should be used in any upcoming hearing.

Attempted Murder Arrests

On February 6, 2016 at approximately 1:35 a.m., **three men were shot while inside** the Santa Clara Bar located in the 500 block of S. Bond Street. **An 18 year old male** was shot in the head and is in critical condition at an area hospital, a **28 year old male** was shot in the upper body and is expected to survive while **a 20 year old man** was grazed in the left foot, and refused medical treatment.

After an ongoing and extensive investigation three suspects have been arrested and charged in this case.

20 Year old Melvin Zavala of the 7200 block of Gough Street, 25 year old Nehemias Batista of Baby Bird Court in Halethorpe, Maryland, and 24 year old Argueta Andres of the 3000 block of Varder Street each have been arrested and are now facing 3 counts of 1st degree attempted murder.

It appears that this shooting happened as a result of a dispute that occurred inside the bar.

All three suspects are now in Central Booking, waiting to see a court commissioner.

Although the suspects are in custody, this investigation remains open. Detectives are asking anyone with information pertaining to this incident to call (410) 396-2100.

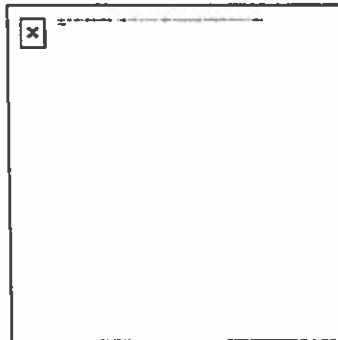

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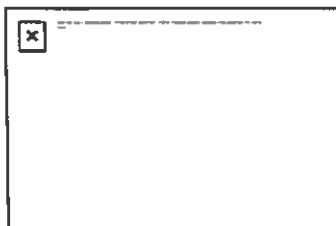

Restaurants—including live entertainment and dancing are listed as conditional uses in the B-1-2 Business District under Subsection 6-208. The Board may approve conditional uses subject to the requirements and provisions of Subsections 14-102, 14-103, 14-204, & 14-205. Under Subsection 14-103, before the Board approves any conditional use, it may impose on the



establishment, location, construction, maintenance, and operation of the conditional use any conditions, restrictions, or limitations that the Board considers necessary or desirable to:

- (1) reduce or minimize any effect of the use on other properties in the neighborhood;
- (2) secure compliance with the standards and requirements of this title; and
- (3) better carry out the intent and purposes of this article.

Under Subsection 14-309, any restaurant or tavern that seeks a conditional use authorization to provide live entertainment, dancing, or both as an accessory use;

- (1) In addition to the information required under § 14-201 {"Applications"} of this title or otherwise required by the Board, the application for conditional use must include:

- (i) a description of the type of live entertainment or dancing to be provided; and
- (ii) a floor plan, in the form and with the detail that the Board requires, of:

- (A) the establishment generally; and

- (B) the live entertainment or dancing venue within the establishment.

- (2) If dancing is to be provided, the floor plan must show:

- (i) the location and dimensions of the dance floor; and

- (ii) the maximum authorized occupant load, as approved by the Fire Department, for all configurations of:

- (A) the establishment generally; and

- (B) the dancing venue within the establishment.

In approving a conditional use, the Board must specify precisely the types of live entertainment or dancing to which the use is limited and impose conditions, as appropriate, concerning:

- (1) days and hours:

- (i) of the establishment's general operations as a restaurant or tavern; and
- (ii) of the live entertainment or dancing to be provided;
- (2) use of amplification, noise levels, and need for noise proofing;
- (3) limits on the size of the establishment or on the size, location, or configuration of the entertainment or dancing venue within the establishment;
- (4) number of live entertainers;
- (5) number of seats proposed for outdoor table service;
- (6) exterior lighting;
- (7) public need and desire for the establishment;
- (8) number and location of other, similar establishments in the area and potential effect of the new use on those establishments;
- (9) proximity of residences, schools, religious institutions, or parks to the establishment;
- (10) maximum authorized occupant loads of the establishment and of the live entertainment or dancing venue within the establishment;
- (11) volume and types of vehicular and pedestrian traffic in the area of the establishment;
- and
- (12) the establishment and maintenance of:
 - (i) a traffic management plan;
 - (ii) a parking management plan;
 - (iii) an indoor and outdoor security plan; and
 - (iv) a sanitation plan.

Under Subsection 1-182.1, restaurant means a business establishment at which:

- (1) food and drinks are provided to the public, primarily for on-premises

consumption by seated patrons; and

(2) if the establishment also serves alcoholic beverages:

(i) a full menu of food and drinks is prepared primarily on premises in a fully equipped kitchen capable of preparing food for the rated seating capacity; and

(ii) annually, the average daily receipts from the sale of food exceeds 50% of the establishment's total average daily receipts, not including sales of novelty items, income from vending machines, cover charges, or other receipts not derived from the sale of food or beverages.

Exclusion: restaurant does not include any tavern.

Taverns—including live entertainment and dancing are not listed as permitted or conditional uses in the B-1-2 Business District under Subsections 6-206 or 6-208. Under the provisions of Subsection 3-106, any use that is not expressly allowed in a district is prohibited.

The request in this case is to add live entertainment to the existing restaurant/tavern in a B-1-2 Neighborhood Business District. It was testified by the appellant that this property is a three story structure located on the northeast corner S. Bond Street and Fleet Street. The first floor of the property is used as a restaurant/tavern known as the Santa Clara Restaurant & Bar. The owner of the restaurant is seeking authorization to include karaoke entertainment to his business. The appellant submitted a written report addressing conditions required to establish live entertainment as follows:

- The business will be open seven days per week between the hours of 9:00 am to 2:00 am;

- Live entertainment will be presented primarily in the evenings between 7:00 pm and 11:00 pm Sunday – Thursday and 7:00 to 12:30 Friday & Saturday;
- The Santa Clara Restaurant will maintain at all times acceptable noise levels to assure proper operation within the community and adjacent property. Noise levels will range between 40-80 dB and comply with the levels set by the Baltimore City Noise Ordinance and the Maryland State Department of the Environment Statute, whichever is lower;
- The appellant submitted a floor plan of the first floor interior space indicating the proposed live entertainment area;
- The number of entertainers is limited to one person who will direct the Karaoke entertainment for customers of the restaurant and tavern;
- There is no outdoor seating for this restaurant;
- The existing capacity of the building will not exceed 65 people; and
- The Santa Clara customers may park at the Bank of America parking lot within 300 feet of the restaurant;

The appellant submitted a signed Memorandum of Understanding between the Santa Clara Restaurant & Bar and the Fells Point Residents Association, Dallas Street Neighborhood Association, and the PS 25 Condo Association in support subject to the following conditions:

- **KARAOKE** – Karaoke will be limited to Sunday through Thursday from 7:00 pm to 11:00 pm and Friday and Saturday from 7:00 pm to 12:30 am; No audio system will be permitted to provide volume levels in excess of that which is normally used for current sound amplification;
- **DISC JOCKEYS** – No disc jockeys are allowed;

- DANCING – Neither dancing nor a dance floor will be allowed;
- LIVE MUSICAL/SPEAKING ACTS – no other live musical or speaking acts will be permitted;
- DOORS AND WINDOWS – all windows and doors are to be closed during Karaoke entertainment and when jukebox is played;
- VOLUME LEVEL – all sound systems will be limited in power to a CD player, digital musical storage devices or a juke box. All audio will be played at a volume limit that is normal and customary for an unamplified musical performance, not to exceed local noise ordinances. No additional speakers may be provided on the interior and no speakers will be allowed outside 529 S. Bond Street;
- Security – The operator of the Santa Clara Restaurant and Bar or any future operator is subject to this agreement and shall provide additional security during hours of operation of the Karaoke Entertainment. Security personnel shall ensure that the area immediate adjacent to the Santa Clara Restaurant and Bar are regularly patrolled and customers are not disturbing the neighbors. Santa Clara Restaurant and Bar and its employees shall discourage illegal activity from occurring within or nearby this place of business. Further, any instances or suspected instances or criminal activity, including but not limited to prostitution, loitering, public drunkenness, fighting, and suspected drug activity shall immediately be reported by Santa Clara Restaurant and Bar or its employees to the Baltimore City Police Department.

The Board received a report from the Department of Planning recommending that if approval is granted it shall be subject to the following conditions:

- A copy of the use and occupancy permit for the premises must be kept on the premises and available for inspection by representatives of Baltimore City at all times;
- The applicant must obtain CHAP approval for any exterior changes, including signs;
- A copy of the written approval by the Board of Municipal & Zoning Appeals of the live entertainment provided on premises, including details of any restrictions or limitations on the live entertainment provided, must be kept on the premises and available for inspection by representatives of Baltimore City at all times; and
- A copy of all other permits and licenses required pursuant to the written approval of the Board of Municipal & Zoning Appeals also must be kept on premises and available for inspection by representatives of Baltimore City at all times.

The Board, in making its decision to approve this appeal finds that this request with conditions is reasonable, and will not have a negative impact on the adjacent properties or the immediate area, subject to the following conditions;

- The use of the premises with live entertainment is subject to the above conditions submitted to the Board by the appellant, the signed MOU, and the Department of Planning recommendations; and
- The Board may require an adjustment to the noise level if necessary to lessen a negative impact on adjacent neighbors and the immediate area.

The Board has given due regard to the nature and condition of the adjacent uses and structures, the facts presented, reports from City Agencies and standards for conditional uses in general under Title 14 of the Zoning Code, and in detail under Section 14-309 for restaurants and taverns with live entertainment or dancing. The Board considered the nature of the surrounding

area and the extent to which the proposed use might impair its present and future development. The Board cannot find that the proposed use will be detrimental to or endanger the public health, security, general welfare, or morals of the community. The Board also finds that the use is not in any way precluded by any other law; including an applicable Urban Renewal Plan and that this authorization is not otherwise in any way contrary to the public interest and is in harmony with the purpose and intent of the Zoning Code of Baltimore City. Therefore, based on the findings and facts, applicable laws and provisions of the Zoning Code, reasons expressed herein and subject to the aforementioned conditions, the Board approves the application.

Baltimore police say violent crash, triple shooting in Fells Point bar unrelated



Warning: violent crash and possible language from onlookers. Video has emerged from a wild crash scene in Fells Point from some time early Saturday on Broadway near Fleet Street. Police said it is unrelated to a triple shooting at a nearby bar.

Three men were shot inside a bar and a 27-year-old bystander was seriously injured in a hit-and-run in two separate, unrelated incidents that occurred overnight in Fells Point, the **Baltimore Police Department** said Saturday.

The events — one of which was captured on a gruesome video that circulated widely on social media — left the historic neighborhood, known for its shopping, restaurants and bars, and nightlife, in shock over the level of violence that occurred within blocks of each other and less than an hour apart.

"It's horrifying. You never would imagine something like this happening," said Kelley Heusler, who owns a boutique in Fells Point near where the hit-and-run occurred.

Police spokesman TJ Smith said officers have arrested the man suspected of being the driver in the hit-

and-run, which occurred about 2:15 a.m. and was captured in what Smith described as "an absolutely horrific and disgusting video."

The video shows a minivan in the 700 block of South Broadway trying to flee two assailants by ramming into nearby cars and reversing wildly onto a sidewalk.

The van struck a 27-year-old woman who had just left a nearby bar, which police did not identify. She is in the hospital with serious injuries, including broken ribs and skull fractures, Smith said.

Officers arrested Orlando Redd, 37, of Parkville, a few blocks away, Smith said. Redd, who police was under the influence of alcohol at the time, was charged with assault, malicious destruction of property and counts of endangerment, and was issued numerous traffic citations, police said.

Redd did not have an attorney listed in online court records, and his family could not be reached for comment Saturday night.

Police are working to determine if additional charges are warranted and are seeking information about the assailants. They do not know what started the incident, Smith said. He said no other serious injuries have been reported, calling that a "blessing."

"You see that chaotic scene play out and you just hold your breath," he said. "We're fortunate that we're not talking about a much larger tragedy as a result of these reckless acts."

On Saturday morning, parts of Dogwatch Tavern — in the path of the van when it jumped a curb in reverse — were boarded up, as passersby peered at the remnants of the crash. A woman who answered the phone at Dogwatch declined to comment Saturday morning, saying staff members there were waiting for more information.

Police are also looking for information connected to the violence that happened blocks away inside the Santa Clara bar and restaurant, in which two men opened fire, shooting three people — two in the head.

Homicide detectives were investigating Saturday morning. On Saturday afternoon, two of the men who were shot in the head remained in the hospital, one with life-threatening injuries, the other in stable condition. The third, who was shot in the foot, declined treatment.

Police did not identify anyone involved in the incident, which occurred about 1:30 a.m. inside the restaurant, located at Fleet and Bond streets. Police said they did not have information about the motives of the shooters, who fled in a dark-colored vehicle.

The Santa Clara bar and restaurant was open Saturday, but those inside said they weren't there when

the incident unfolded. The owner was not available for comment.

"It's a coincidence that they happened in close proximity, but neither has anything to do with the other," Smith said.

City Councilman James B. Kraft, who represents the area, called the events "a tragedy." He said additional officers have been on patrol after recent incidents involving rowdy bar patrons. Because the shooting and hit-and-run happened within a short period of time, had officers not been busy with the shooting, he said, officers would have been able to interject sooner during the hit-and-run.

"We really do believe, at least police believe, if the shooting hadn't occurred, then the road rage wouldn't have occurred because police would have been down there," he said.

Kraft said he hopes Fells Point's visitors will see that the incident was isolated.

"It's not a crime wave. It's a series of incidents that occurred in a limit period time, not a continuing pattern of behavior, but it's very hard to convey that," he said.

Kraft said that on Saturday morning, he had already heard from some businesses and plans to have a community meeting to discuss how to prevent a similar incident in the future.

Heuisler, who owns the Poppy and Stella boutique across from Dogwatch, said the city and the Fells Point community "tend to rally around our neighbors."

She said she didn't personally know the woman who was struck but created a GoFundMe page to raise money for her. Within three hours, 458 people had raised more than \$15,000, according to the site.

"We try and look out for each other," she said. "I know they are going to have a lot ahead of them."

The triple shooting followed another shooting a few blocks away that occurred Friday afternoon, in which a 37-year-old man was shot in the stomach. He told police the incident occurred in the 400 block of S. Castle Street, near a Royal Farms in Upper Fells Point.

Detectives ask anyone with information to call detectives at 410-396-2100 or Metro Crime Stoppers' anonymous tip line at 1-866-7LOCKUP. Smith said police were grateful to the person who recorded the video of the hit-and-run and expect it to help in the investigation.

Also on Saturday, police identified two people killed Friday.

Eric Dorsey, 42, was shot and killed about 9 a.m. Friday in the 3900 block of Penhurst Avenue in Northwest Baltimore.

Sabrina Kelly, 53, was shot in the head about 2:20 p.m. inside a home in the 1000 block of East North Avenue. She later died of the injuries.
