**BOARD OF LIQUOR LICENSE COMMISSIONERS FOR BALTIMORE CITY
RELEASES ADDITIONAL GUIDANCE ON RESTRICTIONS CONCERNING
CARRYOUT AND DELIVERY OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN LIGHT OF
GOVERNOR'S EXECUTIVE ORDER ISSUED ON MARCH 16, 2020**

Baltimore, MD – On March 18, 2020, the Board of Liquor License Commissioners for Baltimore City (BLLC) issued additional guidance to licensed establishments in Baltimore City concerning carry out and delivery procedures for alcoholic beverage service in light of Governor Lawrence J. Hogan's Executive Order published on March 16, 2020.

Chairman Matricciani stated that "Due to the recent restrictions imposed on the licensees regarding on-premises consumption by the Governor's Executive Order, the BLLC believes it is in the best interest of all stakeholders to understand and abide by the limitations set forth for the provision of alcoholic beverages for off-premises consumption." He added, "To this end, I have instructed the BLLC to create and publish additional information to ensure licensees comply with the Governor's Executive Order."
