Happy Holidays!

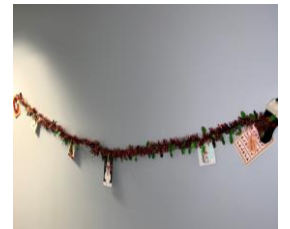
The Board and Staff of BLLC wish all of our stakeholders Happy Holidays!

New Year's Eve Hours

For New Year's Eve in Baltimore City, the law allows for licensed establishments to remain open past 2am and for the remainder of the day on January 1st. This does not apply to package goods licensees, those who hold a Class "A" License. Class "A" licenses must close at midnight as they would on their normal business days. Expect to see your favorite bar or restaurant remaining open beyond 2am if they choose to do so. The BLLC Inspections Division will be working all night into the early morning hours to monitor establishments and respond to any concerns.
