BLLC 2024 Rules and Regulations Translated

BLLC adopted new rules and regulations on April 18, 2024, and these went into effect on May 3, 2024. All licensees and their employees must adhere to the 2024 Alcoholic Beverages Rules and Regulations as well as its 2024 Adult Entertainment Rules and Regulations if they have an Adult Entertainment license.

BLLC in the Community: BPD District Level Partnerships

BLLC staff have recently been attending and presenting at the Commanders and CRC meetings of the Baltimore Police Department. BLLC inspections division districts align with BPD districts which allows for better collaboration in specific areas with one of our most important agency partners.

In the past month, BLLC Deputy Executive Secretary Michelle Wirzberger, Chief Inspector John Chrissomallis, and the Community Liaison, Matt Achhammer, have made presentations to both the Southern and Central Districts, and will be making the rounds to the other BPD district meetings in the coming months. They also presented to the BPD NCO Unit earlier this year, to ensure that NCO officers have a working understanding of liquor laws and available resources to guide them when interacting with licensed establishments in their Districts. This collaboration will continue in each District, as well as with planned presentations to BPD command staff and regular communication with the NCO Units citywide.
