Violation of Rule 3.12 – General Welfare (Disturbing the Peace) – November 18, 2023 – On November 18, 2023, Agent Perez responded to Oasis Restaurant & Discotec located at 3919 Eastern Avenue to investigate 311 complaints # 23-00919253 and # 23-00919258 for loud music and disturbing the peace. Upon arrival at the establishment, Agent Perez assessed that the music playing in the establishment could be heard on the 3800 block of Eastern Avenue which is 1 block south of the establishment. At 12:40 AM, he made contact with the licensee, Mr. Alejo Martinez and explained the reason for his visit. He also indicated that these types of complaints had been received multiple times in the past and that several warnings had been issued to the establishment. Mr. Martinez stated that he was not aware of the problem and that his previous manager had failed to communicate these issues with him. Agent Perez indicated that he would issue one last warning if the licensee lowered the volume on the music and maintained the music at the reduced volume. The licensee agreed to reduce the volume; however, as soon as Agent Perez stepped outside of the building, he noticed that the music volume was turned back up to the original level that prompted the complaint. He immediately reentered the establishment and notified Mr. Martinez that he would be issuing violations and Mr. Martinez indicated that the disc jockey had increased the volume without his consent. 

On 11/18/2023 I Agent Perez responded to 311 complaints# 23-00919253 and 23-00919258 for loud music/disturbing the peace at Oasis Restaurant & Discotec located at 3919 Eastern Ave. Upon arrival to the establishment, I proceeded to make an assessment of the noise level by driving around the block. I was able to hear the music playing at the establishment with excessively strong base at the 3800 block which is 1 block away south of the establishment. At approximately 12.40am I made contact with the licensee, Mr. Alejo Martinez and explained the reason for my visit. I also reminded Mr. Martinez that several of these same complaints had been received in a constant basis and several warnings had been issued to the establishment. Mr. Martinez stated that he was not aware of this issue and also stated that his previous manager had failed to communicate this matter to him and that's one of the reasons why his manager was no longer an employee of his. I informed Mr. Martinez that I would issue one last warning to for the loud music if the music is lowered and maintained at that level. Mr. Martinez agreed to lower the music and informed me that the establishment was open for the event taking place that night and that the establishment would remain closed until a new manager was hired. At this time, I proceeded to leaving the establishment but as soon as a stepped outside the building I noticed that the music volume was turned up to the level I had originally found. I made contact with Mr. Martinez and informed him that a violation would be written for disturbing the peace and failure to cooperate with keeping the music volume down. Mr. Martinez did apologize for this and stated that the disc jockey turned the volume up without his consent. I then left the establishment at approximately 1:25am with nothing further to report.
