Agent Perez also overheard the bouncer tell the group that there was a \$20 cover charge to enter and one individual in the identified group stated she had "\$100 in Cash App." When the Task Force completed the inspection at the establishment, they moved to the next business. Agent Perez remained at the 2 O'clock Club to see if the underage group of girls would be permitted to enter the establishment. After approximately 5 minutes, Agent Perez observed the group being allowed inside. Inspector Tudhope, Inspector Jordan and Agent Perez then proceeded back inside the 2 O'clock Club and identified the group of presumed underage patrons sitting on the side benches against the wall facing the stage and bar. Inspector Tudhope asked to see the girls' identification. Upon inspection of their Maryland issued identification cards, it was observed that three of the five individuals were under the age of 21: a Ms. Sarah Karcher with a DOB 11/2004; Ms. Kealynn Prodoehl with a date DOB 5/2004; and Ms. Madison Prodoehl DOB 5/2004. The Inspectors and Agent Perez made contact with the Manger, a Mr. Christopher Deandre Scott, as identified by his Maryland driver's license. They informed him that the establishment would be receiving a violation. The Inspectors and Agent left the establishment with nothing further to report.

If you fail to appear at the above location at the date and time as instructed by the agency, the Board will proceed with the hearing and will take such action regarding the suspension or revocation of your license and permits as warranted by evidence. Upon completion of our inspection I, Inspector Tudhope and Brown observed smoking still taking place inside and Informed Mr. Scott that he was to immediately get everybody to stop smoking. Mr. Scott shrugged again and asked what we wanted him to do about it. I informed Mr. Scott that we would not be leaving till he complied. Mr. Scott at this time instructed his DJ to announce that there was to be no smoking and instructed his security to enforce it. Mr. Scott was issued violations and Inspectors left establishment without further incident.




