**Re: Protest of Liquor License Renewal of the Edgewood Liquor Store located on at 3022 Edgewood Street Baltimore, MD. 21215**

Dear Board of Liquor License Commissioners for Baltimore City (BLLC),

Residents of the Community are requesting that the License for the Edgewood Liquor Store not be renewed. The presence of this liquor store has cause great harm to the neighborhood with the failing to enforce Baltimore City Code ART. 19, § 25-2. The excessive Loitering has perpetuated a growing level of criminality that has deterred residents from feeling safe in and around their homes. There has been a total of five (5) murders this year within a two-block radius. Specifically, the murder of a 34 Rian Williams on December 28, 2021 at the corner of the establishment which is steps away from the store's front door. The Edgewood Liquor Store is in violation of Rule 3.12, Rule 4.13 and Rule 4.16 of the Alcoholic Beverages Rules and Regulations:


*Rule 3.12 – Public Welfare (a) Licensees shall operate their establishments in such a manner as to avoid disturbing the peace, safety, health, quiet, and general welfare of the community.*

*Rule 4.16 – Illegal Conduct (a) No licensee shall commit or allow the commission on his premises of any act which shall be contrary to any federal, state or local statute, law or ordinance or against the public peace, safety, health, welfare, quiet or morals. (b) No licensee shall commit, allow, or facilitate an environment where the commission on his premises of any act of violence shall be contrary to any federal, state or local statute, law or ordinance or against the public peace, safety, health, welfare, quiet or morals.*

*Rule 4.13 – Drugs and Illegal Narcotics (a) A licensee, his or her agent(s) and/or employee(s) must not permit the licensed premises to be used for the sale, transfer, accommodation for the sale or transfer, or possession of any controlled dangerous substance as defined by the Annotated Code of Maryland. (b) A licensee, his or her agent(s) and/or employee(s) must not use, possess, sell or allow to be used, dispensed, or sold on the licensed premises any type of illegal drugs or narcotics.*

The residents cannot live in peace with fighting with the constant loitering and nefarious activity. Calls to the Baltimore City Police Department has provided some relief but residents fear for their safety when having to provide their personal information. After years of continuous calls to the police, several documentations of community complaints, and continuous loitering in this area, the residents need relief. That relief must come by denying a renewal of the Liquor License.












**Protest of Renewal Petition:** Under the authority granted to the Board in Alc. Bev. Art. §§12-1801 & 4-406 and Alc. Bev. Art. §12-1805, the Board brings this protest of renewal against the establishment in consideration of specific complaints that resulted in three (3) separate incidents that resulted in violations, which were sustained by the Board at hearings within license year 2021-2022:

(a) **Licensee(s) Information:** (1) Ganga Prasad Adhikari; and (2) Ram B. KC; and (3) Joshua A.P. Patel. The license transferred to the current ownership on 1/14/2021.

(b) **Corporate Standing:** 517 Broadway, LLC is a Maryland LLC and as of 4/12/2022 is active and in good standing.

(c) **Violation History for license year 2021-2022:**

**1. On February 17, 2022 the licensee(s) sustained violation(s) for the following charge(s):**

**Violation of Rule 4.01(a) Sales to Minors – January 6, 2022** – On January 6, 2022, Board of Liquor License Commissioners (BLLC) Inspector Walter Robinson, Chief Inspector John Chrissomallis along with Baltimore Police Department Vice Unit (BPD Vice) Detective Gatto, and Police Cadets J. Carrington and T. Gertsinger conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. At the time of the incident, Cadets Carrington and Gertsinger were under the age of 21; the cadets were given a departmental \$20 bill that was marked by photograph prior to any investigations commencing.

At approximately 9:00PM, Cadets Carrington and Gertsinger entered the establishment. Cadet Carrington purchased two 100ml bottles of Fireball Whiskey for a total of \$6.00, which the Cadet paid for using the departmental \$20 bill. After the purchase, Cadets Carrington and Gertsinger exited the establishment carrying the alcoholic beverages. Members of the joint agency task force entered the establishment and contacted the seller, who was identified as Ganga Adhikari, which was verified by his identification card. BPD Vice and BLLC staff informed Mr. Adhikari that he had sold alcohol to an underage police cadet. The alcoholic beverages and change from the transaction was returned to the establishment and the departmental \$20 bill was recovered. A BLLC violation was issued for sales to a minor; inspector Robinson acknowledges that the inspection sheet he provided to the establishment indicated an incorrect bottle size. The joint agency task force departed without further incident.

**2. On August 12, 2021 the licensee(s) sustained violation(s) for the following charges(s):**

**Violation of Rule 4.01(a) Sales to Minors – July 7, 2021** – On July 7, 2021 Board of Liquor License Commissioners (BLLC) Agent Andy Perez, Inspector Walter Robinson, Chief Inspector John Chrissomallis along with Baltimore Police Department Vice Unit (BPD Vice) Detectives Greenhill, Gatto and Lebrun and Police Cadet J. Thomas conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. Cadet Thomas was given a departmental \$20 bill, which was marked by a photograph, prior to the incident. At approximately 9:10pm, the joint agency task force entered the establishment. Cadet Thomas, who was under the age of 21 at the time of the incident, purchased a



single 24oz. bottle of Corona beer from the server, later identified as Atul Thapa, for \$3.50 using the marked \$20 bill. After the purchase and being furnished the alcoholic beverage, Cadet Thomas exited the establishment carrying the alcoholic beverage in a black plastic bag. Subsequently, BLLC Inspectors and BPD Vice entered the establishment and contacted a server who initially could not be properly identified as he did not have identification on his person. The employee then verbally identified himself as Atul Thapa. Mr. Thapa was informed that he just sold and furnished alcohol to a minor Police Cadet. 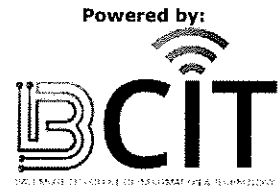
