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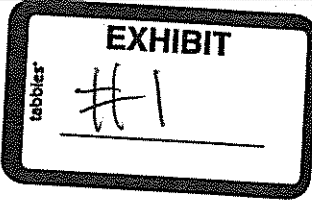

On 14 March 18 at 2255hrs(10:55pm), Detective Greenhill along with members of IIS-Vice, as well as Liquor Inspector Andy Perez and Agent John Chrissomallis from the Baltimore City Liquor Control Board, conducted an Underage Sales to Minor Investigation at the "Jewel Box" an Adult Entertainment nightclub located at 419 East Baltimore Street. Also working was Baltimore City Police Cadet Malik Bradford-Day with a date of birth of October 1997, making him 20 years of age at the time of this investigation. Cadet Bradford-Day whom was working in an undercover capacity, entered the "Jewel Box" located at 419 East Baltimore Street. Cadet Bradford-Day entered the establishment, sat at the bar and ordered a "Budlite" beer priced at \$7.00 from Miss Lafoya Sharpe, F/B/28, 09/08/89, Cadet Bradford-Day paid using a departmental \$20 and received change. Cadet Bradford-Day sent a text to Detective Greenhill indicating that he had just purchased alcohol from the establishment known as the "Jewel Box". At no time did Miss Sharpe ask Cadet Bradford-Day for proof of age. Detective Greenhill then notified the other members of Vice as well as the Liquor Board and advised them that Cadet Bradford-Day had just purchased alcohol.

Minutes later Detective Gatto along with Liquor Inspector Andy Perez and Agent John Chrissomallis, entered the "Jewel Box" located at 419 East Baltimore Street and advised Miss Sharpe that alcohol was sold to an underage police cadet. Detective Gatto recovered the departmental \$20 and the change received was returned back to the liquor establishment. Agent Chrissomallis photographed the "Budlite" beer and returned it back to the liquor establishment as well. Detective Greenhill advised Miss Sharpe that she would not be criminally charged, but a report would be written for the liquor establishment. At that time the investigation was concluded and the establishment was left in the control of Miss Sharpe.

Report forwarded to Liquor Board for further administrated review.

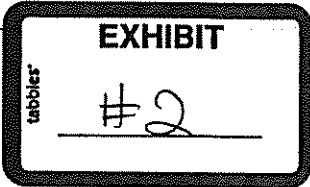

Agent Chrissomallis and Det. Greenhill advised the night manager Marissa Trilli she had sold alcohol to an underage police cadet. Furthermore, a copy of these events will be forwarded to the Baltimore City Liquor Board. The alcoholic drink was left with the night manager. All events occurred in Baltimore City Maryland.

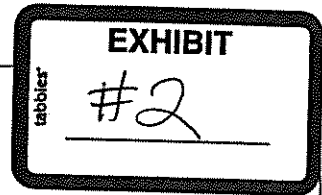

On 14 April 2018 at 0010hrs(12:10am), Detective Greenhill of IIS-Vice, Investigators from Baltimore Housing, Inspectors from the Health and Fire Department, and Inspectors from the Baltimore City Liquor Control Board all of which make up the Social Club Task Force, conducted an inspection at "Birdland Sports Bar & Grill" located at 6317-19 Belair Road. The above listed licensees were not present at the time of the investigation, but night manager Kenneth Lee Tyler was present and in full operational control of the premises. At the time of the investigation the bar was full patrons, some were drinking, others were eating as we noticed a full operational kitchen on the premises. At that point Detective Greenhill asked Mister Tyler for the Liquor License and all of the permits. Mister Tyler produced the Liquor License along with the Fire certificate and other permits that were available at that time. At that time Capt Quarles observed the current fire certificate to be expired and not up to date. He advised Mister Tyler to produce a current fire certificate, which he could not. At that point, Capt Quarles ordered the premises closed. Also on scene was Inspectors' Melanie Clark and Todd Ward from the Health Department and Inspector Clark informed Detective Greenhill of some major Health code violations that would result in the closure of the premises as well. In addition to the establishment operating without a current and up to date Fire Certificate, other fire code violations that were observed. A propane tank was found in the kitchen area and needed to be removed. The ansul system needed to be serviced and all cooking had to cease until the system was properly serviced. Any and all exit signs needed to be repaired and/or replaced. And the establishment could not open until properly inspected by the Fire Department. Inspectors' from the Health Department found the entire kitchen dirty, with uncleaned dishes to include pots and pans piled in the sink. A pot of used grease was observed sitting on the stove and a pot of grease was observed on a shelf with other food products. The grease trap was improperly used with a microwave sitting on top of it. The entire kitchen area was unsanitary throughout which resulted in the closure by the Health Department as well. Investigator McGinnis from Baltimore Housing observed multiple electrical violations to include exposed wirings, an improperly mounted electrical panel, along with other electrical issues. Additional violations included, was dirty bathroom room vents, damaged floor tiles, cracked glass on the front door, and bulk trash and debris in the rear of the property. The licensee, Mister Casey Jenkins later arrived onscene after being notified by the night manager Kenneth Tyler. Each violations that was observed by Health, Fire, and Housing representatives was explained to Mister Jenkins. Furthermore, Mister Jenkins was advised that the establishment known as "Birdland" located at 6317-19 Belair Road would be closed until re-inspected by Health and Fire Departments. At that time the investigation was concluded and the premises was left in the control of licensee, Mister Jenkins.

Re: Cease and Desist Letter – No Promoting Pub Tour without a Liquor License Permit

Dear Sir or Madam,

It has come to the attention of the Board of Liquor License Commissioners for Baltimore City (BLLC) that an event filed under Lindy Promotions set for March 10, 2018 has been advertised without the proper licensure or permits. ***This letter serves as notice to the promotor or organizer of the event that the promotion of the event without the proper permits is an offense and can be punishable by suspension and fines.***

As per Alc. Bev. Art § 12-1101.1(c), "A pub crawl promoter or a participating license holder on behalf of a pub crawl promoter shall obtain the permit from the Board before the cub crawl promoter may publicize, sell tickets for, organize, operate, produce, or stage a pub crawl". Recently, the BLLC received numerous complaints from concerned citizens in the area that there have been advertisements and promotions for the event on March 10, 2018, which a license has not yet been obtained from the BLLC to the promoter.

Per Alc. Bev. Art. § 12-2802(c), the BLLC Board may impose a penalty based on this action. As the article subsection § 12-2802(c)(1) states "For the offense of publicizing, selling tickets for, organizing, operating, producing, facilitating, or staging a pub crawl with the knowledge or a reason to know that a pub crawl promoter's permit required under § 12-1101.1 of this title has not been obtained, the Board shall impose a fine of note less than \$1,000 and not more than \$3,000 or suspend the license or both." As well as § 12-2802(c)(2) states "A person who violates 12-1101.1 of this title may not be granted a promoter's permit for at least 1 year."

§ 12-1101.1. Pub crawl promoter's permit.

- **(a) Definitions.** --
 - (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
 - (2) "Pub crawl" means an event in which:
 - (i) an organized group of at least three license holders whose premises are within walking distance of each other participates in a coordinated promotion to sell or provide alcoholic beverages during a specified time; and
 - (ii) at least 75 individuals are reasonably anticipated to participate.
 - (3) "Pub crawl promoter" means an individual, a for-profit organization, or a nonprofit organization that conducts a pub crawl.
- **(b) Established.** -- There is a pub crawl promoter's permit.
- **(c) Authorized holder.** -- A pub crawl promoter or a participating license holder on behalf of a pub crawl promoter shall obtain the permit from the Board before the pub crawl promoter may publicize, sell tickets for, organize, operate, produce, or stage a pub crawl.
- **(d) Procedure.** --
 - (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the Board may grant the permit to an applicant who submits an application to the Board as provided under Title 4 of this article at least 42 days before the date of the pub crawl.
 - (2) Before being granted the permit, an applicant shall:
 - (i) obtain a special event permit from the Baltimore City Department of Transportation;
 - (ii) provide a copy of the special event permit to the Board; and
 - (iii) provide a completed application that:
 - 1. is signed and dated by each license holder that will participate in the pub crawl;
 - 2. lists each premises for which the pub crawl will be held; and
 - 3. is accompanied by any other document that the Board requires.
 - (3) An application may not be altered within 30 days before the pub crawl is scheduled to take place.
 - (4) Within 14 days after receiving an application, the Board shall grant or deny the permit or request more information from the applicant.
- **(e) Scope of authorization.** -- The permit authorizes the pub crawl promoter and participating license holders to conduct a pub crawl.
- **(f) Duration.** -- The permit for each pub crawl may be in effect for the time stated on the special event permit required under subsection (d)(2) of this section.
- **(g) Regulations.** -- The Board may adopt regulations establishing the requirements for:
 - (1) conducting a pub crawl, including health and safety standards to be met by the pub crawl promoter and participating license holders; and
 - (2) providing public notice of a pub crawl at the premises of participating license holders by the pub crawl promoter or participating license holders.
- **(h) Fees.** --
 - (1) The application fee is \$ 50, payable on the submission of the application.
 - (2) (i) Subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, the permit fee, payable when the permit is granted, is:
 - 1. \$ 120; and
 - 2. \$ 100 for each license holder that participates in the pub crawl.
 - (ii) On receipt of an application, the Board may reduce the permit fee by not more than 50% if the applicant shows that the proceeds from the pub crawl after administrative expenses are deducted shall be used to benefit an organization that is exempt from taxation under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

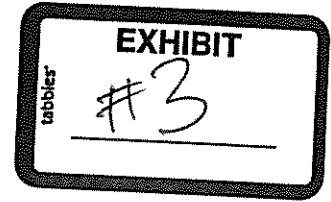
§ 12-2802. Penalty imposed by Board

- **(a) In general.** -- For a violation that is cause for suspension of a license, the Board may:
 - **(1)** except as provided in subsections (b) and (c) of this section, for a first offense, impose a fine not exceeding \$ 500 or suspend the license or both; or
 - **(2)** except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, for each subsequent offense, impose a fine not exceeding \$ 3,000 or suspend the license or both.
- **(b) Underage sales.** -- For a first offense of selling alcoholic beverages to an individual under the age of 21 years, the Board may impose a fine not exceeding \$ 1,000 or suspend the license or both.
- **(c) Promoting pub crawl without permit.** --
 - **(1)** For the offense of publicizing, selling tickets for, organizing, operating, producing, facilitating, or staging a pub crawl with the knowledge or a reason to know that a pub crawl promoter's permit required under § 12-1101.1 of this title has not been obtained, the Board shall impose a fine of not less than \$ 1,000 and not more than \$ 3,000 or suspend the license or both.
 - **(2)** A person who violates § 12-1101.1 of this title may not be granted a promoter's permit for at least 1 year.

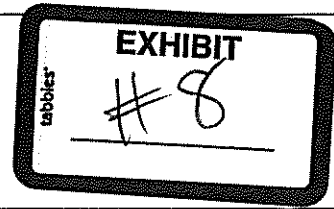
On Friday, March 9, 2018 at approximately 12:28pm Chief Inspector Fosler received an email from community residents concerning the Federal Hill Irish Stroll scheduled for Saturday, March 10, 2018. Based on my reply the residents sent me additional information. After confirming the information on lindyspromotion.com I determined that Lindy Promotions was advertising venues and activities that were not included in their original applications the Liquor Board (BLLC) and Department of Transportation (DOT). Lindy Promotions advertised "One Star Country Club" as a participant in the Federal Hill Irish Stroll. This is a clear violation of their Pub Tour License PTP011. Changes to the participants cannot be made less than 30 days from the scheduled event. Lindy Promotions also included a "Beer Garden" in their advertising. Lindy Promotions submitted an application to DOT for the Federal Hill Irish Stroll that clearly stated "Participating bars and restaurants plan to serve alcohol and other beverages within their venues only". At approximately 1:15pm I called Lindy Promotions and spoke to Samantha. I directed Lindy to remove references to the establishment trading as One Star Country Club. I explained this was deceptive because One Star Country Club was not included on the application or the Pub Tour License for March 10, 2018. I also instructed Lindy to remove any references to a "Beer Garden" in their advertising. I explained Lindy's application to DOT stated alcohol would be "...within their venues only." I further explained no extensions were being issued to licensed liquor establishments because there would be no beer garden and no alcohol on the street because the street was being closed only for public safety. On March 9, 2018 at approximately 1:49pm the problem advertising had been removed from lindyspromotions.com.

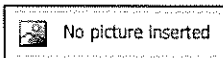

On March 10, 2018 I Agent Chrissomallis while on duty arrived at the Federal Hill area specifically the Cross Street area. Once I arrived I observed Cross Street from Charles Street To Light Street closed with bike racks. Once there i walked inside the closed perimeter and I observed patrons of the Pub Crawl with plastic cups containing alcoholic beverages and bottles containing beer. I asked security to speak with the representative form Lindy Promotions and one Sara Coughlin came out and met me. I asked her for all her permits and she provided me with DOT permits and Liquor Board Permits. None of the licenses and or permits allowed for alcohol to be sold or consumed outside. Mrs. Coughlin told me that she did not know anything about extension permits and that she only new about the permit to close the street. At approx. 430 pm there were 2 bottles that were thrown on Cross Street. At that time I thought that there was a public safety issue and I instructed the security at every establishment on the Cross Street side not to allow anyone with a cup and or a bottle to exit the location. By 515 pm there was no alcohol that I could see on the Cross Street side.

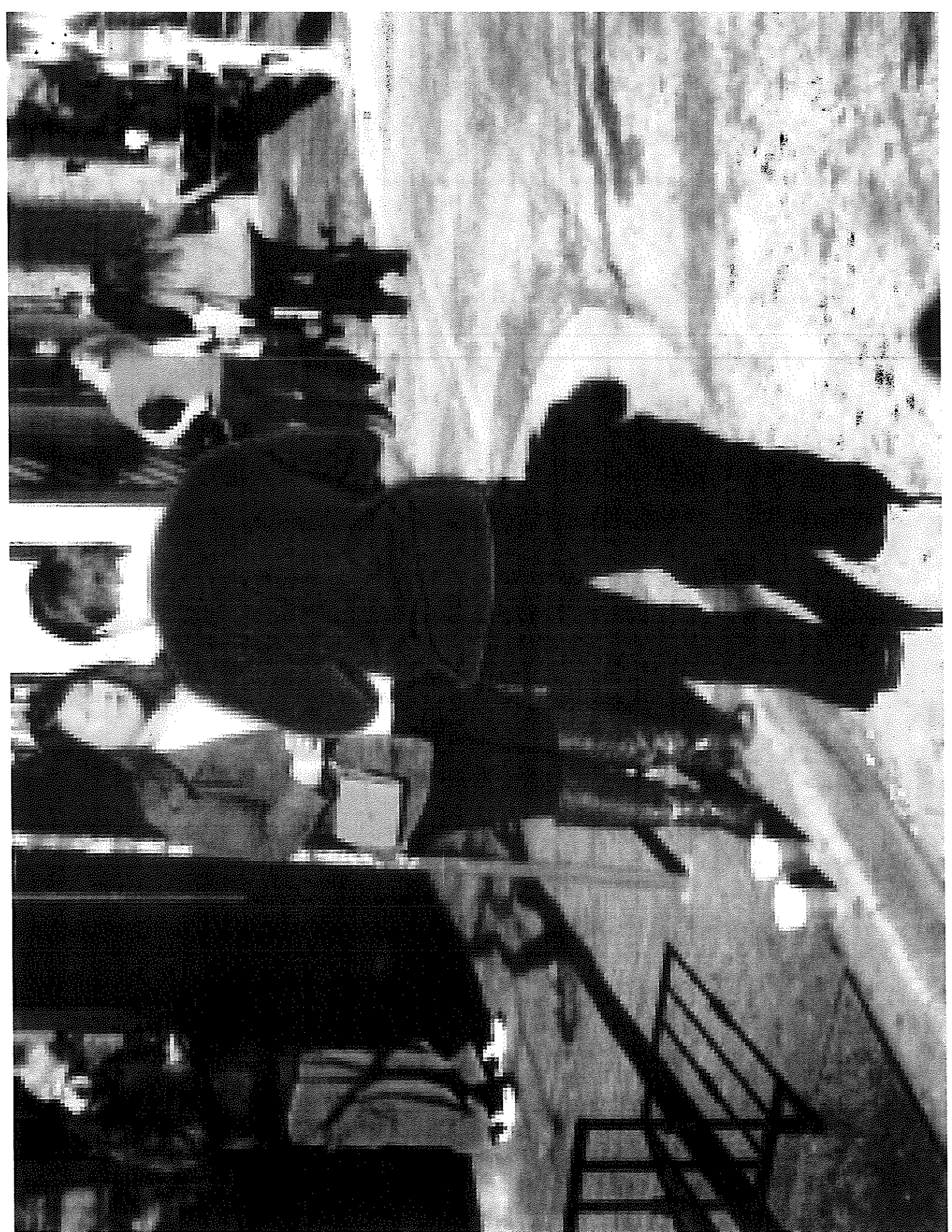

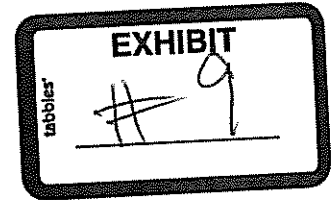
