- (c) **Purchase Price of Business:** The purchase price of the business is \$30,000 via terms of commercial space lease.
- (d) Qualified Voters: Dianna Owens, Bessina Williams, and Bradely Cartwright are qualified Baltimore City voters.
- (e) **Zoning**: Applicant has applied for a USE permit, for the use of the premise 1<sup>st</sup> floor as a restaurant with live entertainment.
- (f) Corporate Standing: The Empanada Lady, LLC is a MD LLC and as of 6/13/2023 is active and in good standing.
- (g) **Posting Report**: The location was posted on 5/19/2023 and checked on 5/29/2023. This meets the 10-day rule. There are 11 licensed liquor establishments in the 4x4 area: "B" BWL-5; "BD7" BWL-5; and "Hotel/Motel" -1.
- (h) **Timeline**: Establishment closed on 12/31/2022. On 1/6/2023, Contract purchaser was substituted via substitute application. On 5/2/2023, A transfer of ownership application was filed by applicants. Which was 122 days after date of closure and transfer application was received. License is valid.
- (i) Letters of Support/Opposition: At this time the Board has no letter(s) of opposition or support.
