

Restaurants—including live entertainment and dancing are listed as conditional uses in the B-2-3 Business District under Subsection 6-308. The Board may approve conditional uses subject to the requirements and provisions of Subsections 14-102, 14-103, 14-204, & 14-205.

Under Subsection 14-103, before the Board approves any conditional use, it may impose on the establishment, location, construction, maintenance, and operation of the conditional use any conditions, restrictions, or limitations that the Board considers necessary or desirable to:

- (1) reduce or minimize any effect of the use on other properties in the neighborhood;
- (2) secure compliance with the standards and requirements of this title; and
- (3) better carry out the intent and purposes of this article.

Under Subsection 14-309, any restaurant or tavern that seeks a conditional use authorization to provide live entertainment, dancing, or both as an accessory use;

- (1) In addition to the information required under § 14-201 {"Applications"} of this title or otherwise required by the Board, the application for conditional use must include:
 - (i) a description of the type of live entertainment or dancing to be provided; and
 - (ii) a floor plan, in the form and with the detail that the Board requires, of:
 - (A) the establishment generally; and
 - (B) the live entertainment or dancing venue within the establishment.
- (2) If dancing is to be provided, the floor plan must show:
 - (i) the location and dimensions of the dance floor; and
 - (ii) the maximum authorized occupant load, as approved by the Fire Department, for all configurations of:
 - (A) the establishment generally; and
 - (B) the dancing venue within the establishment.

In approving a conditional use, the Board must specify precisely the types of live entertainment or dancing to which the use is limited and impose conditions, as appropriate, concerning:

- (1) days and hours:
 - (i) of the establishment's general operations as a restaurant or tavern; and
 - (ii) of the live entertainment or dancing to be provided;
- (2) use of amplification, noise levels, and need for noise proofing;
- (3) limits on the size of the establishment or on the size, location, or configuration of the entertainment or dancing venue within the establishment;
- (4) number of live entertainers;
- (5) number of seats proposed for outdoor table service;
- (6) exterior lighting;
- (7) public need and desire for the establishment;
- (8) number and location of other, similar establishments in the area and potential effect of the new use on those establishments;
- (9) proximity of residences, schools, religious institutions, or parks to the establishment;
- (10) maximum authorized occupant loads of the establishment and of the live entertainment or dancing venue within the establishment;
- (11) volume and types of vehicular and pedestrian traffic in the area of the establishment; and
- (12) the establishment and maintenance of:
 - (i) a traffic management plan;
 - (ii) a parking management plan;
 - (iii) an indoor and outdoor security plan; and
 - (iv) a sanitation plan.

The request in this case is to add live entertainment to the existing restaurant in a B-2-3 Community Business District. It was testified by the appellant that this property is a three story attached building located on the end of a row. The appellant operates a restaurant/tavern known as the Terra Café and is seeking authorization to include live entertainment for his customers. The appellant submitted an application to provide outdoor table service for the restaurant which was approved with conditions on April 12, 2011 per BMZA Appeal 2011-084. During meetings with the community at that time the appellant agreed to seek a proper permit for live entertainment in conjunction with his restaurant/tavern. The appellant submitted drawings and a written report outline the business plan and to show the proposed live entertainment area on the second floor of the restaurant. The Board received a number of letters from neighbors in opposition to this appeal. The opponents expressed concern because the café has held musical events in the past several years and customers congregate on the sidewalk creating a negative impact on the community. The opponents also expressed concern about noise from speakers attached to the exterior which play loud music day and night when the business is open. The Board received a letter and heard testimony from a representative of the Charles Village

The Board received a letter and heard testimony from a representative of the Charles Village Civic Association indicating that they have met with the appellant and recommend support of this appeal only if the following conditions are made part of the live entertainment permit:

- The conditions agreed to by the appellant for the outdoor table service will remain in force and apply to the live entertainment permit as well, and in addition the following conditions will apply;
- No portion of the property shall be used as a restaurant with live entertainment after 9:00 pm Sunday through Thursday, and 11:00 pm on Friday and Saturday;
- Live entertainment may only be conducted indoors;

• The live entertainment area shall have no more than 45 patrons at one time;

- The live entertainment will utilize the existing sound system, any louder system shall be prohibited. No portion of the property shall be used for live entertainment if the volume of the entertainment exceeds the noise levels set by the Baltimore City Noise Ordinance and the Maryland State Department of the Environment Statute, whichever is lower;
- The appellant will enter into a proper lease agreement with any person or entity who
 intends to use any portion of the Property for a special event, which lease agreement
 shall incorporate the conditions and restrictions place on the live entertainment
 permit; and
- The appellant and Terra Café shall prohibit patrons from loitering outside the Property within 300 feet. The appellant shall hire a Security Firm to provide security during the hours of live entertainment and/or special event.

The Board received a report from the Department of Planning recommending approval of this appeal subject to the following conditions:

- A copy of the use and occupancy permit for the premises must be kept on the premises and available for inspection by representatives of Baltimore City at all times;
- A copy of the written approval by the Board of Municipal & Zoning Appeals of the live entertainment provided on premises, including details of any restrictions or limitations on the live entertainment provided, must be kept on the premises and available for inspection by representatives of Baltimore City at all times; and

 A copy of all other permits and licenses required pursuant to the written approval of the Board of Municipal & Zoning Appeals also must be kept on premises and available for inspection by representatives of Baltimore City at all times.

The Board, in making its decision to approve this appeal with conditions finds that in addition to the conditions recommended by the Department of Planning the conditions recommended by the Charles Village Civic Association are also required to lessen any negative impact on the adjacent properties due to this conditional use. The Board considered the nature of the surrounding area and the extent to which the proposed use might impair its present and future development. The Board cannot find that the proposed use will be detrimental to or endanger the public health, security, general welfare, or morals of the community. The Board also finds that the use is not in any way precluded by any other law; including an applicable Urban Renewal Plan and that this authorization is not otherwise in any way contrary to the public interest and is in harmony with the purpose and intent of the Zoning Code of Baltimore City. The Board has given due regard to the nature and the condition of the adjacent uses and structures, the facts presented, reports from City agencies and the standards for conditional uses under Title 14 of the Zoning Code. Therefore, based on the findings and facts, applicable laws and provisions of the Zoning Code, reasons expressed herein and subject to the aforementioned conditions, the Board approves the application.

On 7/7/21 at 2140 hours, the Baltimore city vice unit consisting of myself along with Detective Greenhill and Detective Gatto responded to 3537 E Fairmount avenue which is a bar known as Aqua Bar & Grill. The location is located within the Baltimore city limits. Members of the Baltimore city liquor board, Chief Chrissomallis and Agent Perez were also present with cadet Jordan Thomas who is a Baltimore city police cadet with a date of birth of 1/ /2001 (20).

Further investigation, we were conducting an under age detail in which the cadet entered the location and was served a 2 oz. shot glass of whiskey. The counter person who served cadet Thomas was identified via New York state permit as Mr. Juan De Jesus Vasquez Garcia.

After the cadet was served, same notified Detective Greenhill via cell phone text. At this time, the vice unit and liquor board entered the location and informed Mr. Garcia of the violation.

It was determined that the drink was furnished which is known as starting a bar tab. This allows the patron to drink with the understanding of paying the total of the tab before leaving. At this time, all pertinent information was collected from Mr. Garcia who was cooperative.

Chief Chrissomallis informed Mr. Garcia that an administrative report would be written and forwarded to the liquor board for further review. All events happened in the city of Baltimore, State of Maryland.



On 7/7/2021 at approx at 2231hrs. The VICE unit including Det. Greenhill, Det. LeBrun and Det. Gatto along with the Baltimore City Liquor Board including Chief Chrissomalliss and Agent Perez, were conducting an underage liquor sale detail while utilizing Cadet Thomas. Cadet Thomas is under the age of 21 at the time of the detail. Cadet Thomas was given a departmental \$20 dollar bill which was photo copied and this Detective carried said copy on his person throughout the entire nights detail. At this time we sent Cadet Thomas into 1434 E. Fayette St which is known to our unit and this Detective as Fayette Liquor Plus. We have prior information from the Baltimore City Liquor Board, that employees of this establishment have been hostile and at some times beating up patrons inside the store. As Cadet Thomas walked into the establishment, this Detective and Det. LeBrun were positioned approx 15 yards from the front door of said unit to keep a close eye on our cadet and ensure his safety due to the intel. While Cadet Thomas was inside he met with Manjit Kuar who he asked for a 12 oz Heineken. At this time Cadet exchanged the \$20 dollar departmental bill for a 12 oz bottle of Heineken. As we were sitting in our vehicle an unknown black male approached our vehicle and began looking into our car and walking slowly around same while continuing to stare into our vehicle. He then walked inside the store with the purchased alcohol and began walking to our vehicle. Cadet Thomas then gave Det. LeBrun the alcohol

purchased, which was a \$2.00 Heineken bottle 12 oz. This Detective immediately responded to the store in an attempt to recover our \$20 dollar bill which was being used for the detail. Once I arrived at the front door the same unknown black male I had previously mentioned made eye contact with me and quickly grabbed the front door and pulled it closed and held the door handle in an effort to deny this Detective entry into a public packaged goods store. At this time I grabbed the outer door handle and had to pull with strength just to pull the door open as the unknown male held the other side. Once I got the door opened I and Det. Lebrun immediately ordered the said male to leave the store completely. He did exit the store but attempted to gain entry over and over throughout the entire time we were conducting our investigation. At this time I spoke with the night security guard who I had to order to open the rear counter door so I could retrieve the \$20 dollar bill from the night manager and cashier. Once I met the night manager, she was identified as Mrs Manjit Kaur 2/ /75 of 1434 E. Fayette St. Mrs Kaur was extremely cooperative once we finally were able to interact with just her. She returned our pre recorded \$20 dollar bill and the incident of the sale to the underage minor was explained. At this time the unknown black male continued to argue with members of the Baltimore City Liquor Board and this Detective to his status with the packaged goods store. He claimed he was an employee and demanded to gain entry of the store. After telling him multiple times to leave the location for attempting to disturb our investigation without any progress. I then asked the night manager to identify this individual to determine if he was an employee. At this time Mrs Manjit walked with me to the front door and observed the unknown male in the parking lot cursing and arguing with the detail members. She advised me that he was not an employee of the business and was never an employee of the business. She advised that at times he picks up the trash in the lot in exchange for free water bottles. I then explained to Mrs. Manjit that since she had a security guard at the front door, it is the duty of her staff to keep these issues under control. Explaining that when I was attempting to enter the store and the unknown male held the door closed on me. Her security guard who was standing right behind the unknown male and watching the entire incident should be involved in keeping control of their business. She explained that it would be dealt with in the best way she could describe to me as there was a slight language barrier in our conversation. Mrs. Manjit was notified that an incident report would be written and forwarded to the Liquor Board. The Heineken bottle and \$2.00 change was returned to Mrs. Manjit. All events occurred in Baltimore City Maryland.
