Draft Supplement to the 2024 Alcoholic Beverages Rules and Regulations

Maryland Alcoholic Beverages & Cannabis Article § 12-2105 permits the Board of Liquor License Commissioners for Baltimore City (BLLC) to offer as a compromise, a monetary penalty for certain violations in lieu of appearing before it at a hearing. This process is intended to ensure that violations are handled by the BLLC swiftly and transparently. The Board shall have discretion as to whether a monetary penalty may be offered to a licensee and will consider the Licensee's violation history, relationship with the community in which the licensed premises is located, and the egregiousness of the violation when determining eligibility for the program.

For reference, the matrix of fees corresponds with and cites the 2024 BLLC Rules and Regulations, found on our website at https://llb.baltimorecity.gov/rules-regulations. Other factors considered in the proposed fees include the legal limitations per Maryland Alcoholic Beverages & Cannabis Article 12-2802(a)(1) of a maximum fine of \$500 for the first offense.

The public may submit comments on this draft regulation by email to <u>BLLC@baltimorecity.gov</u>. At 11:59 pm on August 26, 2024, the BLLC will close the comment period to the public and review all suggested amendments, modifications, and additions to the proposed regulation. Upon receipt and review of the comments regarding the regulation, the Board will decide on the final version of the rule to be adopted at the September 5, 2024, hearing of the Board. The program will be fully implemented for any violations written on or after Friday, September 20, 2024.

Rule 2.16-Monetary Penalty in Lieu of Hearing.

1) Eligibility:

- a. The violation is eligible for a monetary penalty in lieu of a hearing if:
 - i. The matrix indicates that the charged violation is eligible.
 - ii. The Licensee is charged with multiple violations stemming from the same incident and ALL violations qualify for this program according to the matrix.
- b. The violation is **not eligible** for a monetary penalty in lieu of a hearing if:
 - i. The Licensee has had two (2) or more of the same type of violation in the prior four (4) year period. (The below examples are not exclusive but for illustrative purposes only: Ex.#1 If the Licensee was charged with trash violations in 2022 and 2023, a trash violation in 2024 would not be eligible. Ex.#2 If the Licensee was charged with trash violations in 2022 and 2023, but no unrelated violations such as insufficient lighting or signs, those violations would be eligible for participation in the program.)
 - ii. The violation type is not listed in the matrix and stems from noncompliance with an MOU with the community in which the Licensee's establishment is located.
 - iii. The Licensee is charged with multiple violations stemming from the same incident and one (1) or more violations do not qualify for this program according to the matrix.
 - iv. The Licensee is charged with a violation that requires a hearing before the Board.
 - v. The Board determines that the Licensee or licensed establishment is ineligible for this program.

2) Process:

- a. Notice of Violations and Offer:
 - i. In accordance with the attached matrix, the Board or its designee shall prepare a formal letter to the Licensee that explains the violations alleged against the Licensee, including any evidence that the agency has collected in support of the alleged violations. The letter shall state:
 - 1. That the Licensee is eligible for the Monetary Payment in Lieu of Hearing (MPLH) program.
 - 2. The amount of the monetary penalty for each alleged violation.
 - That to participate in the MPLH program, the Licensee agrees to
 voluntarily waive his/her right to a show cause hearing, admit to the
 facts of the violations as alleged, take the corrective action
 prescribed in the offer by the Board, and accept the amount of the
 monetary penalty.
 - 4. That the Licensee may request a show cause hearing before the Board
 - 5. That the signed letter and payment must be received at the BLLC office by the date provided in the letter.
 - 6. That failure to submit the signed letter and payment of the fine, if applicable, by the date specified will result in the issuance of a cease-and-desist order prohibiting the Licensee from selling alcohol.

7. That if a cease-and-desist order is issued it will remain in place until the Board receives the signed letter indicating acceptance or rejection of the offer and the fine that is due, if applicable.

b. Hearing:

i. If the Licensee requests a show cause hearing, the hearing shall be scheduled as soon as practicable. The MPLH program letter will be included in the packet of information distributed and available to the public along with the docket for the date on which the hearing will be held.

c. Transparency:

- d. The Board shall maintain a database of all MPLH program offers including all licensees who accepted or rejected the MPLH program offer.
- e. An MPLH offer will be noted in a Licensed Premise's electronic file and hard copy file.
- f. An accepted offer will be noted on the docket for the first hearing scheduled immediately following the acceptance of the offer.
- g. All accepted offers will be read into the record during the hearing in which the case is listed on the docket.

The premises is improved by a three story corner building: café with 14 dwelling units & 1 rooming unit. The proposed use is to add live entertainment to restaurant with outdoor table service.

Restaurants—including live entertainment and dancing are listed as conditional uses in the B-2-3 Business District under Subsection 6-308. The Board may approve conditional uses subject to the requirements and provisions of Subsections 14-102, 14-103, 14-204, & 14-205.



Under Subsection 14-103, before the Board approves any conditional use, it may impose on the establishment, location, construction, maintenance, and operation of the conditional use any conditions, restrictions, or limitations that the Board considers necessary or desirable to:

- (1) reduce or minimize any effect of the use on other properties in the neighborhood;
- (2) secure compliance with the standards and requirements of this title; and
- (3) better carry out the intent and purposes of this article.

Under Subsection 14-309, any restaurant or tavern that seeks a conditional use authorization to provide live entertainment, dancing, or both as an accessory use;

- (1) In addition to the information required under § 14-201 {"Applications"} of this title or otherwise required by the Board, the application for conditional use must include:
 - (i) a description of the type of live entertainment or dancing to be provided; and
 - (ii) a floor plan, in the form and with the detail that the Board requires, of:
 - (A) the establishment generally; and
 - (B) the live entertainment or dancing venue within the establishment.
- (2) If dancing is to be provided, the floor plan must show:
 - (i) the location and dimensions of the dance floor; and
 - (ii) the maximum authorized occupant load, as approved by the Fire Department, for all configurations of:
 - (A) the establishment generally; and
 - (B) the dancing venue within the establishment.

In approving a conditional use, the Board must specify precisely the types of live entertainment or dancing to which the use is limited and impose conditions, as appropriate, concerning:

- (1) days and hours:
 - (i) of the establishment's general operations as a restaurant or tavern; and
 - (ii) of the live entertainment or dancing to be provided;
- (2) use of amplification, noise levels, and need for noise proofing;
- (3) limits on the size of the establishment or on the size, location, or configuration of the entertainment or dancing venue within the establishment;
- (4) number of live entertainers;
- (5) number of seats proposed for outdoor table service;
- (6) exterior lighting;
- (7) public need and desire for the establishment;
- (8) number and location of other, similar establishments in the area and potential effect of the new use on those establishments;
- (9) proximity of residences, schools, religious institutions, or parks to the establishment;
- (10) maximum authorized occupant loads of the establishment and of the live entertainment or dancing venue within the establishment;
- (11) volume and types of vehicular and pedestrian traffic in the area of the establishment; and
- (12) the establishment and maintenance of:
 - (i) a traffic management plan;
 - (ii) a parking management plan;
 - (iii) an indoor and outdoor security plan; and
 - (iv) a sanitation plan.

The request in this case is to add live entertainment to the existing restaurant in a B-2-3 Community Business District. It was testified by the appellant that this property is a three story attached building located on the end of a row. The appellant operates a restaurant/tavern known as the Terra Café and is seeking authorization to include live entertainment for his customers. The appellant submitted an application to provide outdoor table service for the restaurant which was approved with conditions on April 12, 2011 per BMZA Appeal 2011-084. During meetings with the community at that time the appellant agreed to seek a proper permit for live entertainment in conjunction with his restaurant/tavern. The appellant submitted drawings and a written report outline the business plan and to show the proposed live entertainment area on the second floor of the restaurant. The Board received a number of letters from neighbors in opposition to this appeal. The opponents expressed concern because the café has held musical events in the past several years and customers congregate on the sidewalk creating a negative impact on the community. The opponents also expressed concern about noise from speakers attached to the exterior which play loud music day and night when the business is open.

The Board received a letter and heard testimony from a representative of the Charles Village Civic Association indicating that they have met with the appellant and recommend support of this appeal only if the following conditions are made part of the live entertainment permit:

- The conditions agreed to by the appellant for the outdoor table service will remain in force and apply to the live entertainment permit as well, and in addition the following conditions will apply;
- No portion of the property shall be used as a restaurant with live entertainment after
 9:00 pm Sunday through Thursday, and 11:00 pm on Friday and Saturday;
- Live entertainment may only be conducted indoors;

• The live entertainment area shall have no more than 45 patrons at one time;

- The live entertainment will utilize the existing sound system, any louder system shall
 be prohibited. No portion of the property shall be used for live entertainment if the
 volume of the entertainment exceeds the noise levels set by the Baltimore City Noise
 Ordinance and the Maryland State Department of the Environment Statute, whichever
 is lower;
- The appellant will enter into a proper lease agreement with any person or entity who
 intends to use any portion of the Property for a special event, which lease agreement
 shall incorporate the conditions and restrictions place on the live entertainment
 permit; and
- The appellant and Terra Café shall prohibit patrons from loitering outside the Property within 300 feet. The appellant shall hire a Security Firm to provide security during the hours of live entertainment and/or special event.

The Board received a report from the Department of Planning recommending approval of this appeal subject to the following conditions:

- A copy of the use and occupancy permit for the premises must be kept on the premises and available for inspection by representatives of Baltimore City at all times;
- A copy of the written approval by the Board of Municipal & Zoning Appeals of the
 live entertainment provided on premises, including details of any restrictions or
 limitations on the live entertainment provided, must be kept on the premises and
 available for inspection by representatives of Baltimore City at all times; and

 A copy of all other permits and licenses required pursuant to the written approval of the Board of Municipal & Zoning Appeals also must be kept on premises and

available for inspection by representatives of Baltimore City at all times.

The Board, in making its decision to approve this appeal with conditions finds that in addition to the conditions recommended by the Department of Planning the conditions recommended by the Charles Village Civic Association are also required to lessen any negative impact on the adjacent properties due to this conditional use. The Board considered the nature of the surrounding area and the extent to which the proposed use might impair its present and future development. The Board cannot find that the proposed use will be detrimental to or endanger the public health, security, general welfare, or morals of the community. The Board also finds that the use is not in any way precluded by any other law; including an applicable Urban Renewal Plan and that this authorization is not otherwise in any way contrary to the public interest and is in harmony with the purpose and intent of the Zoning Code of Baltimore City. The Board has given due regard to the nature and the condition of the adjacent uses and structures, the facts presented, reports from City agencies and the standards for conditional uses under Title 14 of the Zoning Code. Therefore, based on the findings and facts, applicable laws and provisions of the Zoning Code, reasons expressed herein and subject to the aforementioned conditions, the Board approves the application.
