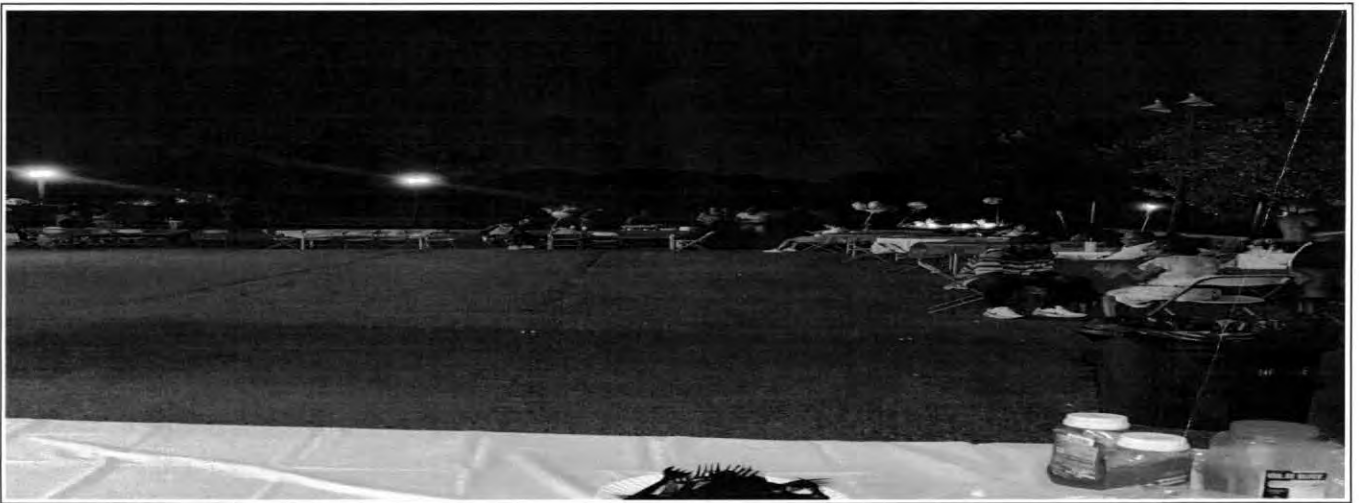

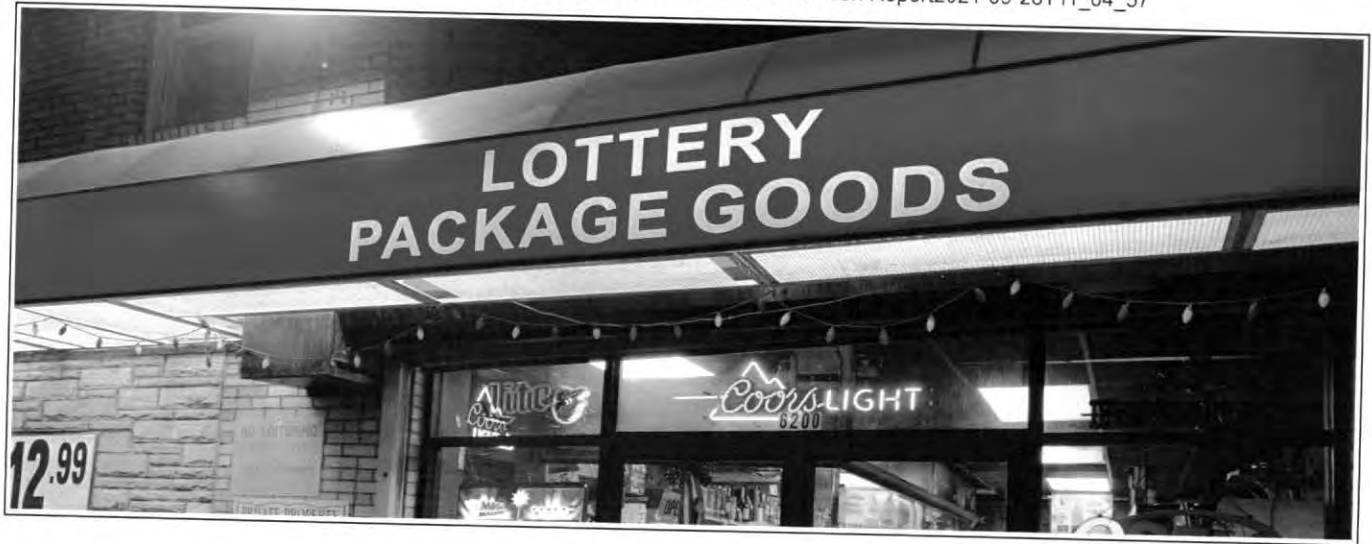

Also working with Vice and the Liquor Board was Baltimore Police Cadet Isaiah T. Jackson, with a date of birth of 03/ /2001, making him 20 years of age at the time of this investigation. 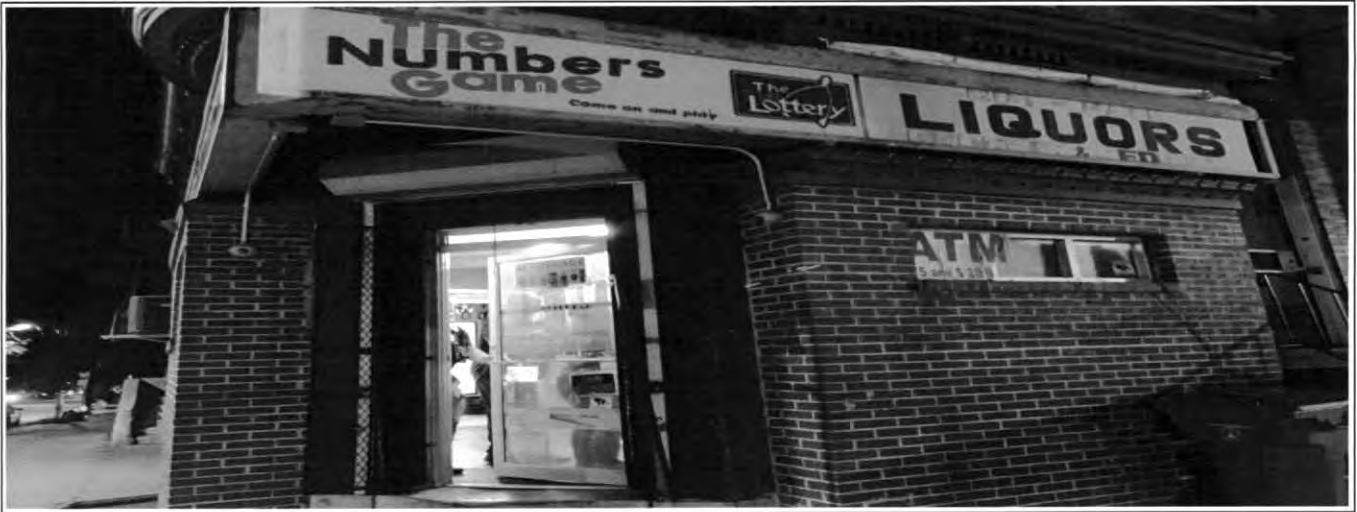
