Daniel Bustos, Azteca de Oro, Inc. T/a Azteca de Oro, 4901 Eastern Avenue - Class “B” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 3.12 “Licensees shall operate their establishments in such a manner as to avoid disturbing the peace, safety, health, quiet, and general welfare of the community” on August 7, 2009 (Re: Liquor Board inspector reported loud music, patron leaving establishment with open container, other patrons leaving establishment and urinating, patrons still entering and exiting establishment and making noise as they left in their vehicle from the church parking lot); **Violation of Rule 4.18** “No licensee shall commit or allow the commission on his premises of any act which shall be contrary to any federal, state or local statute, law or ordinance or against the public peace, safety, health, welfare, quiet or morals” on July 25, 2009 (Re: Licensee providing entertainment/adult entertainment on first floor of licensed premises without Liquor Board or Zoning Board approval); on July 25, 2009 (Re: Licensee does not have 2009 Trader’s License); **Violation of Rule 3.03(c)** “Licensees shall keep on their premises records containing the legal names, aliases, addresses, ages, and Social Security numbers of all persons employed by them. Such records shall be open for inspection at all times by duly authorized representatives of the Board, the Police Department of Baltimore City, and other governmental agencies” on July 25, 2009 (Re: Licensee unable to produce employee records); **Violation of Article 2B §10-301(j)(1)** “In Baltimore City, unless a licensee presents to the Board of Liquor License Commissioners by June 30 of the respective year, a certificate issued by the Director of Finance, showing that there are no unpaid taxes on the merchandise, fixtures and stock of the applicant due to the City of Baltimore or the State of Maryland, the renewal license shall be immediately suspended without a hearing but thereafter shall be immediately returned without a hearing upon presentation of such a certificate” from June 30, 2009 to date (Re: Licensee has failed to provide proof of payment of 2008-2009 personal property taxes; letter sent July 9, 2009); **Violation of Article 2B §6-201(d)(1)(viii)(2)** “A licensee annually, at the time the license is renewed, shall file with the Board of Liquor License Commissioners for Baltimore City a statement of average daily receipts and an affidavit

of a licensed certified public accountant that verify that the licensee has met the requirement of sub-subparagraph 1 of this subparagraph or subparagraph (ix) of this paragraph” on April 2, 2009 to date (Re: Licensee has failed to submit food sales information for period March 2008-April 2009; letter send July 9, 2009)
