Dear Licensee(s):

On March 1, 2024 the alcoholic beverages license renewal process for the Board of Liquor License Commissioners for Baltimore City (BLLC) begins. As per State law, the license renewal season ends on March 31, 2024. If your renewal application and processing fee of \$50 has not been submitted and accepted by the BLLC either in person or via mail by March 31, 2024 it will be deemed late.¹

For your convenience, we have enclosed the 2024 renewal application along with a FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions) sheet. The renewal application, FAQ sheet, and other applicable renewal documents can also be found on our website: <http://llb.baltimorecity.gov/renewal>.

To successfully submit your 2024 alcoholic beverages renewal application, please perform the following:

- Submission of a complete application, which requires the licensees to answer all applicable questions in the renewal application. If you believe a section does not apply to you, write "N/A" on the application.
- Submission of an application that includes the notarized signatures of all licensees.
- If you hold a Class "B" Beer, Wine, and Liquor Restaurant license in the 46th Legislative District, then you must also submit a "food form" accompanied by an affidavit of a licensed certified public accountant.
- If you hold a Class "A" Beer, Wine, and Liquor license, a Class "A-2" Beer, Wine, and Liquor license or a Class "A-7" Beer, Wine, and Liquor license then you must also submit an affidavit attesting you maintain and operate a surveillance system equipped with high-definition cameras that provide continuous, 24-hour video monitoring **without** audio recording capacity placed inside and outside the licensed premises.¹
- A \$50 renewal application processing fee by check or money order made payable to the "Director of Finance."

For each day that the application is late, a late fee of \$50 per calendar day will be imposed, not to exceed \$1,500.
