1. **Thomas W. Hamrick and Yenys Carolina Silva, Carolina Tex-Mex Restaurant, LLC, T/a Carolina's Tex-Mex Restaurant, 500 S. Wolfe Street – Class "B" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.16 Illegal Conduct – October 6, 2020** – At approximately 10:30 PM, Baltimore City Liquor Board Inspector Walter Robinson and Inspector Cindy Tudhope responded to a 311 call for service (#20-00686651) regarding loud music emanating from the establishment. Upon arrival at the establishment, BLLC inspectors parked their cars and observed the location for 10 minutes. After 10 minutes, the inspectors exited their vehicles and entered the establishment. Upon approach, the Inspectors could hear unreasonably loud music emanating from the establishment. After entering the establishment, Inspectors went to the second floor and observed a "drag show" taking place. The BLLC inspectors informed the bartender of the noise complaint and checked the liquor license to determine if the establishment had the privilege of providing live entertainment attached to their license. Upon review of the establishment's license it was determined that the location was not authorized to provide live entertainment. BLLC inspectors then informed the bartender that a violation would be issued for the loud noise and provision of live entertainment without authorization. The bartender instructed the performers to end the show and the BLLC left the scene.

Violation of Rule 3.12 General Welfare – October 6, 2020 – At approximately 10:30 PM, Baltimore City Liquor Board Inspector Walter Robinson and Inspector Cindy Tudhope responded to a 311 call for service (#20-00686651) regarding loud music emanating from the establishment. Upon arrival at the establishment, BLLC inspectors parked their cars and observed the location for 10 minutes. After 10 minutes, the inspectors exited their vehicles and entered the establishment. Upon approach, the Inspectors could hear unreasonably loud music emanating from the establishment. After entering the establishment, Inspectors went to the second floor and observed a "drag show" taking place. The BLLC inspectors informed the bartender of the noise complaint and checked the liquor license to determine if the establishment had the privilege of providing live entertainment attached to their license. Upon review of the establishment's license it was determined that the location was not authorized to provide live entertainment. BLLC inspectors then informed the bartender that a violation would be issued for the loud noise and provision of live entertainment without authorization. The bartender instructed the performers to end the show and the BLLC left the scene.

Upon arrival at the establishment, BLLC inspectors parked their cars and observed the location for

10 minutes. After 10 minutes, the inspectors exited their vehicles and entered the establishment. Upon approach, the Inspectors could hear unreasonably loud music emanating from the establishment. After entering the establishment, Inspectors went to the second floor and observed a "drag show" taking place. The BLLC inspectors informed the bartender of the noise complaint and checked the liquor license to determine if the establishment had the privilege of providing live entertainment attached to their license. Upon review of the establishment's license it was determined that the location was not authorized to provide live entertainment. BLLC inspectors then informed the bartender that a violation would be issued for the loud noise and provision of live entertainment without authorization. The bartender instructed the performers to end the show and the BLLC left the scene.

2. **David Tobash, Soldi Fossa, LLC, T/a The Chasseur, 3326-28 Foster Avenue – Class "BD7" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.16 Illegal Conduct – December 18, 2020** – At approximately 9:45 PM, the Social Club Task Force, which consisted of members of the Baltimore City Police Department, Fire Department, Health Department, Department of Housing and Community Development, and the BLLC responded to the location to determine if the establishment was operating in violation of Mayor Brandon Scott's Executive Order issued December 11, 2020, which prohibited any on-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages. Upon arrival, Inspector Cindy Tudhope and Det. L.C. Greenhill proceeded up the rear exterior staircase to the third floor of the establishment. Upon reaching the rear entrance on the third floor, Inspector Tudhope peered into a window and observed a large crowd of individuals inside of the establishment. Upon entering the establishment, Inspector Tudhope observed individuals seated at the bar area consuming alcoholic beverages. Inspector Tudhope also observed that few patrons were wearing masks within the establishment. Members of the Social Club Task Force contacted the manager Mr. Brian Dennis and license Mr. David Tobash, both of whom were on the premises. At that time, BLLC Inspector Tudhope informed Mr. Tobash and Mr. Dennis that the establishment was in violation of Mayor Scott's Executive Order and instructed them to clear the establishment of patrons. Inspector Tudhope counted 18 patrons exiting the establishment while it was being cleared. After the establishment was cleared, the BLLC issued a violation and left the establishment.

Violation of Rule 3.12 General Welfare – December 18, 2020 – At approximately 9:45 PM, the Social Club Task Force, which consisted of members of the Baltimore City Police Department, Fire Department, Health Department, Department of Housing and Community Development, and the BLLC responded to the location to determine if the establishment was operating in violation of Mayor Brandon Scott's Executive Order issued December 11, 2020, which prohibited any on-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages. Upon arrival, Inspector Cindy Tudhope and Det. L.C. Greenhill proceeded up the rear exterior staircase to the third floor of the establishment. Upon reaching the rear entrance on the third floor, Inspector Tudhope peered into a window and observed a large crowd of individuals inside of the establishment. Upon entering the establishment, Inspector Tudhope observed individuals seated at the bar area consuming alcoholic beverages. Inspector Tudhope also observed that few patrons were wearing masks within the establishment. Members of the Social Club Task Force contacted the manager Mr. Brian Dennis and license Mr. David Tobash, both of whom were on the premises. At that time, BLLC Inspector Tudhope informed Mr. Tobash and Mr. Dennis that the establishment was in violation of Mayor Scott's Executive Order and instructed them to clear the establishment of patrons. Inspector Tudhope

counted 18 patrons exiting the establishment while it was being cleared. After the establishment was cleared, the BLLC issued a violation and left the establishment.

3. **Jacson Munoz and Marilyn Munoz, El Rincon Troncaleno, LLC, T/a El Rincon Troncaleno, 422-26 S. Macon Street – Class “B” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.16 Illegal Conduct – August 15, 2020** – At approximately 11:15 PM, Baltimore City Liquor Board Agent Andy Perez, Agent Terri Chase, Darryl Clark and Inspector Walter Robinson responded to two (2) 311 calls for service (#20-00546854 and #20-00546853) regarding loud music emanating from the establishment. Upon arrival at the establishment, BLLC inspectors could hear unreasonably loud music emanating from the establishment as they approached. At the front of the establishment inspectors observed a tent set up with tables and chairs placed on the curb directly in front of the establishment, thus allowing for alcoholic beverage service to be provided to patrons. At the time of this observation, the establishment lacked the required liquor board permit to provide temporary outdoor table service. Inspectors also observed tables distanced less than six feet apart and some tables with over six individuals seated at them. Lastly, BLLC inspectors observed three (3) individuals seated at the bar consuming alcoholic beverages in violation of Mayor Bernard C. “Jack” Young’s Executive Order issued August 7, 2020. After making these observations, Agent Perez contacted the licensee Jascon Munoz who was on the premises. Agent Perez informed Mr. Munoz of the violations. Mr. Munoz was issued a violation and inspectors left the scene.

Violation of Rule 3.12 General Welfare – August 15, 2020 – At approximately 11:15 PM, Baltimore City Liquor Board Agent Andy Perez, Agent Terri Chase, Darryl Clark and Inspector Walter Robinson responded to two (2) 311 calls for service (#20-00546854 and #20-00546853) regarding loud music emanating from the establishment. Upon arrival at the establishment, BLLC inspectors could hear unreasonably loud music emanating from the establishment as they approached. At the front of the establishment inspectors observed a tent set up with tables and chairs placed on the curb directly in front of the establishment, thus allowing for alcoholic beverage service to be provided to patrons. At the time of this observation, the establishment lacked the required liquor board permit to provide temporary outdoor table service. Inspectors also observed tables distanced less than six feet apart and some tables with over six individuals seated at them. Lastly, BLLC inspectors observed three (3) individuals seated at the bar consuming alcoholic beverages in violation of Mayor Bernard C. “Jack” Young’s Executive Order issued August 7, 2020. After making these observations, Agent Perez contacted the licensee Jascon Munoz who was on the premises. Agent Perez informed Mr. Munoz of the violations. Mr. Munoz was issued a violation and inspectors left the scene.

Violation of Rule 4.16 Illegal Conduct – September 4, 2020 – At approximately 12:30 AM, Baltimore City Liquor Board Agent Darryl Clark and Inspector Jordan responded to a 311 call for service (#20-00679750) regarding loud music emanating from the establishment. Upon arrival at the establishment, BLLC inspectors could hear unreasonably loud music emanating from the establishment as they approached. As inspectors entered the establishment they discovered several staff members and patrons not wearing protective face coverings (A violation of Mayor Bernard C. “Jack” Young’s Executive Order issued August 7, 2020), the establishment was overcrowded, and patrons were dancing – this establishment does not have live entertainment privileges attached to their license. After making these observations, Agent Clark contacted the licensee Jascon Munoz who was on the premises. Agent Clark informed Mr. Munoz of the

Fairmount Avenue – Class "BD7" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.16 Illegal Conduct – December 4, 2020** – At approximately 9:35 PM, Baltimore City Liquor Board Inspector Kenyatta Washington responded to location with members of the Social Club Taskforce, which consisted of the Baltimore City Police Department, Fire Department, Housing Department, and Health Department, to conduct an

inspection of the establishment. Upon arrival, Inspector Washington observed there were two white tents erected that allowed for patrons to consume alcoholic beverages at tables. Inspector Washington observed individuals seated at the tables consuming alcohol. Inspector Washington then entered the establishment and observed 20 individuals sitting at the bar area and seated at tables. Inspector Washington noticed that some of the individuals seated at tables were not eating food, but solely consuming alcohol. As per the Fire Department the maximum occupancy for this location is approximately 48 persons. At this time, Inspector Washington contacted the manager on premise, Mr. Camilo, and inquired as to whether the proper temporary permits were acquired by the establishment to provide outdoor table service. Mr. Camilo could not produce any permits regarding the outdoor table service. At that time, Inspector Washington issued violations related to food service and 25% seating capacity as per Mayor Bernard C. "Jack" Young's Executive Order issued November 12, 2020 and not obtaining the proper permits to provide outdoor table service. After issuing the violations, Inspector Washington left the scene.

Violation of Rule 3.12 General Welfare – December 4, 2020 – At approximately 9:35 PM, Baltimore City Liquor Board Inspector Kenyatta Washington responded to location with members of the Social Club Taskforce, which consisted of the Baltimore City Police Department, Fire Department, Housing Department, and Health Department, to conduct an inspection of the establishment. Upon arrival, Inspector Washington observed there were two white tents erected that allowed for patrons to consume alcoholic beverages at tables. Inspector Washington observed individuals seated at the tables consuming alcohol. Inspector Washington then entered the establishment and observed 20 individuals sitting at the bar area and seated at tables. Inspector Washington noticed that some of the individuals seated at tables were not eating food, but solely consuming alcohol. As per the Fire Department the maximum occupancy for this location is approximately 48 persons. At this time, Inspector Washington contacted the manager on premise, Mr. Camilo, and inquired as to whether the proper temporary permits were acquired by the establishment to provide outdoor table service. Mr. Camilo could not produce any permits regarding the outdoor table service. At that time, Inspector Washington issued violations related to food service and 25% seating capacity as per Mayor Bernard C. "Jack" Young's Executive Order issued November 12, 2020 and not obtaining the proper permits to provide outdoor table service. After issuing the violations, Inspector Washington left the scene

Matricciani, Weidog, LLC, T/a Playbook, 6700 German Hill Road – Class "BD7" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.16 Illegal Conduct – August 5, 2020** – At approximately 11:45 PM, Baltimore City Liquor Board Agent Darryl Clark and Inspector Rosalba Jordan conducted an inspection of the establishment to ensure that it was following of Mayor Bernard C. "Jack" Young's Executive Order issued July 22, 2020. Upon arrival at the establishment, BLLC inspectors could hear unreasonably loud music emanating from the establishment as they approached. At the front of the establishment inspectors observed a disc jockey play music from amplified speakers situated at the threshold of the establishment's outdoor deck – this establishment does not have live entertainment privileges attached to their license. Furthermore, the outdoor deck was found to be overcrowded as the tables were not positioned 6 feet apart per their temporary use and occupancy permit for outdoor table service which specified they can have 8 tables in order to promote social distancing.
