The joint task force responded to the establishment and sent Baltimore City Police Cadets E’lan Brown and Michael Blackwell, who are both under the age of 21, into the establishment to attempt to purchase an alcoholic beverage(s). At that time, Brown and Blackwell entered the establishment and Cadet Brown ordered one “Corona” beer for herself from Ms. Stephanie Johnson, the bartender on duty. After making the request, Ms. Johnson returned and furnished Cadet Brown with the “Corona” beer, but did not request payment at the time. Brown then communicated to the task force that she had purchased an alcoholic beverage(s). Members of the task force entered the establishment, notified Ms. Johnson that an alcoholic beverage(s) had just been purchased to a minor and it would be reported to the BLLC.
