I. Regular Items:

- 1. Robert Brooke Voss and Peter DiPrinzio, JBGB II, LLC, T/a Trade Name Pending, 2600 N. Howard Street, Suite 1100** – Class “B” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Application for a new Class “B” Beer, Wine & Liquor restaurant license under the provisions of Alcoholic Beverages Article §12-1603(c)(1)(ii) requiring \$200,000 in capital investment in restaurant fixtures and facilities and seating capacity for a minimum of 75 people, requesting outdoor table service.
- 2. Jennifer Webber, HMCharmCity, LLC, T/a Trade Name Pending, 2 E. Read Street** – Class “B” Beer, Wine & Liquor Hotel-Motel License – Application for a new Class “B” Beer, Wine and Liquor hotel-motel license under the provisions of Alcoholic Beverages Article §12-904(C) which allows the Board to issue a license for use by a Hotel or Motel that has: (1) a dining room with serving facilities for 125 people; (2) at least 100 Rooms; and (3) a Capital Investment of \$500,000; requesting outdoor table service.
- 3. Dogan Salis, 1741 Corporation, T/a Homeslyce, 2 E. Wells Street** – Class “B” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Application for a new Class “B” Beer, Wine & Liquor restaurant license under the provisions of Alcoholic Beverages Article §12-903(c)(2)(i)-(ii) requiring \$500,000 in capital investment in restaurant fixtures and facilities, 51% of food sales, and seating capacity for 75 but not more than 150 individuals, requesting outdoor table service, off-premise catering, and delivery of alcoholic beverages.
- 4. Jeffrey E. Bejma and Bradley K. Byrnes, Redwood South, LLC, T/a Werner’s Restaurant, 219-31 E. Redwood Street** – Class “B” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Application for a new Class “B” Beer, Wine and Liquor restaurant license under the provisions of Alcoholic Beverages Article §12-1604(c)(2)(ii) requiring \$700,000 in capital investment in restaurant fixtures and facilities, 65% of food sales, and seating capacity for a minimum of 75 people, requesting live entertainment, outdoor table service, off-premise catering and delivery of alcoholic beverages.
- ~~**5. Carlos Navarro Sotelo and Christian Leopoldo Rugel, Amigos Bar, Inc., T/a Amigos Bar, 400 S. Eaton Street** – Class “D” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Request to add a special amusement permit under §12-1003 of the Alcoholic Beverages Article to the existing Class “D” BWL license. Pursuant to §12-1003(c), if the special amusement permit is approved, the licensee may sell beer, wine, and liquor at the hours that the Board specifies. **POSTPONED**~~

William Lents and Ian Newton, Baltimore Whiskey Company, LLC, T/a Baltimore Spirits Company, 1700 W. 41st Street, Unit 430** – Class 1 Distillery License – Application for an on-premises consumption permit under the provisions of Alcoholic Beverages Article §2-202(i)(1)-(3), which authorizes the Board to grant an on-premises consumption permit to an applicant that holds a Class 1 Distillery license. The permit authorizes the holder of a Class 1 Distillery license to sell mixed drinks made from liquor that the holder produces that is mixed with other non-alcoholic ingredients for on-premises consumption.
