- 1. Tesfaye Birru and Fikremariam Worku, Jano Ethiopian Restaurant & Lounge, LLC, T/a Jano Ethiopia, 34 S. Eutaw Street – Class “B” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.01(a) Sales to Minors – July 16, 2019** – At approximately 11:55 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. The joint task force responded to the establishment and sent Baltimore City Police Cadets E’lan Brown and Kameron Snead, who are both under the age of 21, into the establishment to attempt to purchase an alcoholic beverage(s). At that time, Brown and Snead entered the establishment. Brown then went to the bar and ordered two (2) 12 ounce bottles of “Corona” beer from bartender Ms. Jasmine Purdy. Brown purchased the alcoholic beverage(s) with a departmental \$20 bill. After purchasing the alcoholic beverage(s), Snead communicated to the task force via a text message that Brown had purchased an alcoholic beverage(s). Members of the task force entered the establishment and notified Mr. Fikremariam Worku, the licensee who was on the premises at the time, that an alcoholic beverage(s) had just been purchased by a minor and it would be reported to the BLLC. The task force then recovered the marked currency and returned both the alcoholic beverage(s) to Ms. Purdy and/or any change that was provided to Brown.

Violation of Rule 4.16 Illegal Conduct – July 16, 2019 – At approximately 11:55 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. The joint task force responded to the establishment and sent Baltimore City Police Cadets E’lan Brown and Kameron Snead, who are both under the age of 21, into the establishment to attempt to purchase an alcoholic beverage(s). While on line waiting to enter the establishment, Cadet Brown communicated to security personnel that neither Snead nor herself had their State Identifications on their person. Cadet Brown then told security personnel that she was underage, stating that in “5 minutes” she would turn 21. Security staff then collected entry fees from Brown and Snead and without obtain proof of identification and allowed both to enter.

Violation of Rule 3.12 General Welfare – July 16, 2019 – At approximately 11:55 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. The joint task force responded to the establishment and sent Baltimore City Police Cadets E’lan Brown and Kameron Snead, who are both under the age of 21, into the establishment to attempt to purchase an alcoholic beverage(s). While on line waiting to enter the establishment, Cadet Brown

communicated to security personnel that neither Snead nor herself had their State Identifications on their person. Cadet Brown then told security personnel that she was underage, stating that in "5 minutes" she would turn 21. Security staff then collected entry fees from Brown and Snead and without obtain proof of identification and allowed both to enter.

2. **Chae Kuk Cha and Min Cha, Aloha Tokyo, Inc., T/a Aloha Sushi, 1218 N. Charles Street – Class "B" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.01(a) Sales to Minors – June 18, 2019** – At approximately 11:10 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. The joint task force responded to the establishment and sent Baltimore City Police Cadet E'lan Brown, who is under the age of 21, into the establishment to attempt to purchase an alcoholic beverage(s). At that time, Brown entered the establishment and ordered a 375ml bottle of Peach Amsterdam Vodka from Mr. Chae Duk Cha, the bartender/store clerk of the establishment. Brown purchased the alcoholic beverage(s) with a departmental \$20 bill. Upon purchasing the alcoholic beverage Brown communicated to the task force that he purchased an alcoholic beverage(s). Members of the task force entered the establishment and notified Mr. Cha that an alcoholic beverage(s) had just been purchased by a minor and it would be reported to the BLLC. The task force then recovered the marked currency and returned both the alcoholic beverage(s) to Mr. Cha and/or any change that was provided to Brown.

3. **Sherry Munyan-Grimaldi and Sapana Sharma, Pan, Inc., T/a Kitty's Lounge, 3208 Greenmount Avenue – Class "BD7" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.01(a) Sales to Minors – July 16, 2019** – At approximately 9:50 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. The joint task force responded to the establishment and sent Baltimore City Police Cadet E'lan Brown, who is under the age of 21, into the establishment to attempt to purchase an alcoholic beverage(s). At that time, Brown entered the establishment and ordered a 375ml bottle of Peach Amsterdam Vodka from the bartender/store clerk of the establishment. Brown purchased the alcoholic beverage(s) with a departmental \$20 bill. Upon purchasing the alcoholic beverage Brown communicated to the task force that he purchased an alcoholic beverage(s). Members of the task force entered the establishment and attempted to identify the individual that sold Brown the alcoholic beverage. However, the bartender/store clerk did not have identification and refused to provide members of the task for with his identification. Members of the task force then informed the manager on duty, Ms. Patricia Gill, of their inability to obtain the identification of the bartender store clerk. The task force then recovered the marked currency and returned both the alcoholic beverage(s) to the unidentified bartender/store clerk and/or any change that was provided to Brown.

Violation of Rule 3.02 Cooperation – July 16, 2019 – At approximately 9:50 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. Upon purchasing the alcoholic beverage Brown communicated to the task force that he purchased an alcoholic beverage(s). Members of the task force entered the establishment and attempted to identify the individual that sold Brown the alcoholic beverage. However, the bartender/store clerk did not have identification and refused to provide members of the task for with his identification.

Violation of Rule of Rule 3.03(c) Records – July 16, 2019 – At approximately 9:50 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. Upon purchasing the alcoholic beverage Brown communicated to the task force that he purchased an alcoholic beverage(s). Members of the task force entered the establishment and attempted to identify the individual that sold Brown the alcoholic beverage. However, the bartender/store clerk did not have identification and refused to provide members of the task force with his identification. Members of the task force asked for employee records to identify the bartender/store clerk, but the manager on duty could not provide them.

4. **John Burke, Charles W. Gjerde, and Carrie Podles, Alexander's Tavern, LLC, T/a Alexander's Tavern, 710-12 S. Broadway** – Class "B" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – **Violation of Rule 4.01(a) Sales to Minors – July 23, 2019** – At approximately 9:10 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. The joint task force responded to the establishment and sent Baltimore City Police Cadets Konkus and Parker, who are under the age of 21, into the establishment to attempt to purchase an alcoholic beverage(s). At that time, Konkus and Parker entered the establishment and each ordered a 12-ounce can of "Bud Light" beer from Mr. John Hathaway, the bartender/store clerk of the establishment. Mr. Hathaway furnished cans of "Bud Light" beer to Konkus and Parker. Mr. Hathaway started a tab for Konkus and Parker with the understanding that they would pay the balance before exiting the establishment. At that time Konkus and Parker communicated to the task force that they had just been furnished alcoholic beverage(s). Members of the task force entered the establishment and notified Mr. Hathaway that an alcoholic beverage(s) had just been furnished to minors and it would be reported to the BLLC.
5. **Amritpal Singh Mann and Makhanjit Singh, Maan and Jaiya, Inc., T/a Mr. Joe's Bar & Cutrate, 1-3 S. Highland Avenue** – Class "BD7" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – **Violation of Rule 4.01(a) Sales to Minors – July 23, 2019** – At approximately 11:25 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. The joint task force responded to the establishment and sent Baltimore City Police Cadet Konkus, who is under the age of 21, into the establishment to attempt to purchase an alcoholic beverage(s). At that time, Konkus entered the establishment and ordered two (2) 24-ounce cans of National Bohemian Beer from Ms. Verna Ferranie, the bartender/store clerk of the establishment. Konkus purchased the alcoholic beverage(s) with a departmental \$20 bill. Upon purchasing the alcoholic beverage Konkus communicated to the task force that he purchased an alcoholic beverage(s). Members of the task force entered the establishment and notified Ms. Ferranie that an alcoholic beverage(s) had just been purchased by a minor and it would be reported to the BLLC. The task force then recovered the marked currency and returned both the alcoholic beverage(s) to Ms. Ferranie and/or any change that was provided to Konkus.
6. **Philip Han and Joseph Piazza, Broadway North Shed, LLC, T/a Doobyhan Markets, Inc., 1640 Aliceanna Street** – Class "B" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – **Violation of Rule 4.01(a) Sales to Minors – July 23, 2019** – At approximately 9:25 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. The joint task force responded to the establishment and sent

Baltimore City Police Cadet Konkus, who is under the age of 21, into the establishment to attempt to purchase an alcoholic beverage(s). At that time, Konkus entered the establishment and ordered a 12-ounce can of "Flying Dog" Numero Uno beer from Mr. Bryan Reinhold, the bartender/store clerk of the establishment. Konkus purchased the alcoholic beverage(s) with a departmental \$20 bill. Upon purchasing the alcoholic beverage Konkus communicated to the task force that he purchased an alcoholic beverage(s). Members of the task force entered the establishment and notified Mr. Reinhold that an alcoholic beverage(s) had just been purchased by a minor and it would be reported to the BLLC. The task force then recovered the marked currency and returned both the alcoholic beverage(s) to Mr. Reinhold and/or any change that was provided to Konkus.

7. **Rupinder Kour Randhawa and Warren K. Wells, 3206 Eastern, Inc., T/a Eastern Discount Liquors, 3206 Eastern Avenue – Class "A" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.01(a) Sales to Minors – July 23, 2019** – At approximately 10:00 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. The joint task force responded to the establishment and sent Baltimore City Police Cadet Konkus, who is under the age of 21, into the establishment to attempt to purchase an alcoholic beverage(s). At that time, Konkus entered the establishment and ordered two (2) 24-ounce cans of "Steele Reserve" beer from Mr. Simanjeet Singh, the bartender/store clerk of the establishment. Konkus purchased the alcoholic beverage(s) with a departmental \$20 bill. Upon purchasing the alcoholic beverage Konkus communicated to the task force that he purchased an alcoholic beverage(s). Members of the task force entered the establishment and notified Mr. Pritpal Singh, the manager on duty, that an alcoholic beverage(s) had just been purchased by a minor and it would be reported to the BLLC. Members of the task force has problems identifying Mr. Simanjeet Singh because he did not have any identification on his person at the time of the investigation. Mr. Pritpal Singh stated that he was a relative and only helping out. The task force then recovered the marked currency and returned both the alcoholic beverage(s) to Mr. Reinhold and/or any change that was provided to Konkus.

Violation of Alc. Bev. Art. 4-504(a) Employment of Underage Individuals – July 23, 2019 – At approximately 10:00 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. The joint task force responded to the establishment and sent Baltimore City Police Cadet Konkus, who is under the age of 21, into the establishment to attempt to purchase an alcoholic beverage(s). Upon issuing a violation for underage sales, members the task force spoke with Mr. Pritpal Singh, the manager on duty, and were informed that Mr. Simanjeet Singh, the individual who sold the alcoholic beverage to Cadet Konkus, was under the age of 18.

Violation of Rule 4.16 Illegal Conduct – September 10, 2019 – At approximately 1:22 PM, BLLC staff conducted a review of the status of the trader's license of "3206 Eastern, Inc." and found that no such trader's license was issued to this entity for 2019.

Art. §12-1604(c)(3) 51% Food Receipts Requirement for Class B Licensees in the 46th Legislative District – September 24, 2019** – At approximately 11:54 AM, BLLC staff conducted a review of the 46th District Annual Food Sales affidavit submitted by the licensee's certified public accountant as required by law at the time of

renewal. A review conducted by BLLC staff indicated that the average food sale receipts for the establishment for license year 2018-2019 was approximately 22%.

Violation of Rule 4.16 Illegal Conduct – September 24, 2019 – At approximately 11:54 AM, BLLC staff conducted a review of the 46th District Annual Food Sales affidavit submitted by the licensee's certified public accountant as required by law at the time of renewal. Fayette Street – Class "BD7" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.01(a) Sales to Minors – May 21, 2019** – At approximately 10:48 PM, the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. The joint task force responded to the establishment and sent Baltimore City Police Cadet Jaziel Montanez, who is under the age of 21, into the establishment to attempt to purchase an alcoholic beverage(s). At that time, Montanez entered the establishment and ordered a 12-ounce bottle of "Corona" beer from Mr. Ralph Howard, the bartender on duty. Montanez purchased the alcoholic beverage(s) with a departmental \$20 bill. Montanez then communicated to the task force that he been served an alcoholic beverage(s). Members of the task force entered the establishment and notified Mr. Howard that an alcoholic beverage(s) had just been purchased by a minor and it would be reported to the BLLC. The task force then recovered the marked currency and returned both the alcoholic beverage(s) to the bartender and/or any change that was provided to Montanez.
2. **Gabriela Salas, Charro Negro, LLC, T/a Charro Negro, 4617-19 Eastern Avenue – Class "B" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.01(a) Sales to Minors – May 21, 2019** – At

approximately 11:35 PM, the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. The joint task force responded to the establishment and sent Baltimore City Police Cadet Jaziel Montanez, who is under the age of 21, into the establishment to attempt to purchase an alcoholic beverage(s). At that time, Montanez entered the establishment and ordered a 12-ounce bottle of "Corona" beer from Ms. Leonor Morales, the bartender/store clerk of the establishment. Montanez purchased the alcoholic beverage(s) with a departmental \$20 bill. Upon purchasing the alcoholic beverage Montanez communicated to the task force that he purchased an alcoholic beverage(s). Members of the task force entered the establishment and notified Ms. Morales that an alcoholic beverage(s) had just been purchased by a minor and it would be reported to the BLLC. The task force then recovered the marked currency and returned both the alcoholic beverage(s) to Ms. Morales and/or any change that was provided to Montanez.

3. **Soon Se Jhin, H&S, Inc., T/a Pepper's Liquors, 5440 Reisterstown Road – Class "BD7" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.01(a) Sales to Minors – June 18, 2019 –** At approximately 9:45 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. The joint task force responded to the establishment and sent Baltimore City Police Cadet Michael Blackwell, who is under the age of 21, into the establishment to attempt to purchase an alcoholic beverage(s). At that time, Blackwell entered the establishment and ordered a 200ml bottle of Hennessy Cognac Brandy from Mr. Jung Han Wang, the store clerk of the establishment. Blackwell purchased the alcoholic beverage(s) with a departmental \$20 bill. Upon purchasing the alcoholic beverage Blackwell communicated to the task force that he purchased an alcoholic beverage(s). Members of the task force entered the establishment and notified Mr. Wang that an alcoholic beverage(s) had just been purchased by a minor and it would be reported to the BLLC. The task force then recovered the marked currency and returned both the alcoholic beverage(s) to Mr. Wang and/or any change that was provided to Blackwell.
4. **Matthew A. Smith and Sanjiv Suri, Suri Jatin, Inc., T/a M & J Discount Liquors, 5500 Park Heights Avenue – Class "A" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.01(a) Sales to Minors – June 18, 2019 –** At approximately 8:55 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would sell alcoholic beverages to minors. The joint task force responded to the establishment and sent Baltimore City Police Cadet Michael Blackwell, who is under the age of 21, into the establishment to attempt to purchase an alcoholic beverage(s). At that time, Blackwell entered the establishment and ordered a 200ml bottle of Hennessy Cognac Brandy from Mr. Prasanna Adhikari, the bartender/store clerk of the establishment. Blackwell purchased the alcoholic beverage(s) with a departmental \$20 bill. Upon purchasing the alcoholic beverage Blackwell communicated to the task force that he purchased an alcoholic beverage(s). Members of the task force entered the establishment and notified Mr. Adhikari that an alcoholic beverage(s) had just been purchased by a minor and it would be reported to the BLLC. The task force then recovered the marked currency and returned both the alcoholic beverage(s) to Mr. Adhikari and/or any change that was provided to Blackwell.
5. **Chang Ik Choe (PR) and Diana L. Diaz, Song Choe Enterprises, Inc., T/a OK Tavern, 2301 E. Biddle Street – Class "BD7" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.20(c)(ii) Class BD7 Licensees: Open and Operating Tavern at all times – August 29, 2019 –** At approximately

10:30 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would grant access to patrons to the tavern portion of their premises to ensure it was open and operating. Upon arrival, Agent Darryl Clark and Inspector Terri Chase entered the establishment requested access to the tavern portion of the establishment for the purposes of purchasing an alcoholic beverage(s) for on-premises consumption. At this time, bartender/clerk Mr. Charlie Kim informed Clark and Chase that the bar was "closed." Mr. Kim further stated that "they could buy 2 short bottles and a cup of ice to go" if they wanted to consume alcoholic beverage. Clark and Chase exited the establishment and communicated to the task force they were denied access to the tavern portion of the establishment. Members of the task force entered the establishment and notified Mr. Kim of the violation and that it would be reported to the BLLC.

Violation of Rule 3.03(c) Records – August 29, 2019 – At approximately 10:30 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would grant access to patrons to the tavern portion of their premises to ensure it was open and operating. After issuing a violation for denying access to the tavern portion of the establishment, Det. LC Greenhill and Agent Chrissomallis began to conduct a routine inspection of the establishment. At this time, Agent Chrissomallis requested a copy of the establishment's employee records and Mr. Kim could not produce the records on request.

6. **Ho K. Lawler and Albert Yang, HBS Enterprise, Inc., T/a Sugar Hill Tavern, 2361 Druid Hill Avenue – Class "BD7" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.20(c)(ii) Class BD7 Licensees: Open and Operating Tavern at all times – August 30, 2019** – At approximately 12:20 AM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would grant access to patrons to the tavern portion of their premises to ensure it was open and operating. Upon arrival, Agent Darryl Clark and Inspector Terri Chase entered the establishment requested access to the tavern portion of the establishment for the purposes of purchasing an alcoholic beverage(s) for on-premises consumption. At this time, bartender/clerk Mr. Johnathan Smith informed Clark and Chase that "the tavern was under construction" and thus "closed." Clark and Chase exited the establishment and communicated to the task force they were denied access to the tavern portion of the establishment. Members of the task force entered the establishment and notified Mr. Smith of the violation and that it would be reported to the BLLC. Members of the task force also verified that the tavern portion was under construction.
- ~~7. **Kyun Man Kim, Kyun Man, Inc., T/a New Edison Lounge, 3133 35 E. Monument Street – Class "BD7" Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.20(c)(ii) Class BD7 Licensees: Open and Operating Tavern at all times – August 29, 2019**~~ – At approximately 10:00 PM the Baltimore City Police Department and the BLLC conducted random, joint investigations of establishments to determine if licensees would grant access to patrons to the tavern portion of their premises to ensure it was open and operating. Upon arrival, Agent Darryl Clark and Inspector Terri Chase entered the establishment requested access to the tavern portion of the establishment for the purposes of purchasing an alcoholic beverage(s) for on-premises consumption. At this time, bartender/clerk Ms. Coketa Diggins informed Clark and Chase that "the bar was closed and not staffed by a bartender." Clark and Chase communicated to the task force they were denied access to the tavern portion of the establishment. Members of the task force entered the establishment and notified Ms. Diggins of the violation and that it would be reported to the BLLC. Members of the

task force entered the tavern portion of the premises and observed that all alcohol was removed from behind the bar and that the three compartmental sink was non-operational. POSTPONED

8. **Antonio Foster, Noir Restaurant and Lounge, LLC, T/a Noir Restaurant, 5716 York Road – Class “B” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.16 Illegal Conduct – August 30, 2019** – At approximately 8:30 PM, BLLC Chief Inspector Mark Fosler responded to the establishment in reference to complaint concerning unauthorized outdoor table service being utilized by the establishment. As per BMZ2014-145, issued by the Baltimore City Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals’ (BMZA), the establishment’s outdoor table service is limited to two tables and not more than 8 patrons. Upon arrival, Chief Fosler observed two tables alongside the establishment’s wall and four lounge/sofa seats on the sidewalk. On August 24, 2019, the BLLC had received a similar complaint concerning the establishment’s improper use of outdoor table service. On August 27, 2019, Chief Fosler had visited the establishment and spoke with managerial staff concerning the complaint on August 24, 2019. Specifically, Chief Fosler warned management not to exceed the two tables and 8 patron limitation imposed upon them by the BMZA. As Chief Fosler had already warned management on August 27, 2019 about the improper use of their outdoor table service he issued a violation on August 30, 2019 for the additional four lounge/sofa seats on the sidewalk.

Ponca Street – Class “BD7” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 3.08 (b) Sanitation and Safety – August 6, 2019** – At approximately 2:00 PM, BLLC Inspector Cindy Tudhope responded to the establishment and performed a follow up compliance check at the location. Inspector Tudhope had originally conducted an inspection of the establishment on August 3, 2019 while monitoring an event at the location. At that time, Inspector Tudhope had observed overflowing trash cans, full dumpsters, and the area around the establishment littered with trash. On that day, Inspector Tudhope advised managerial staff at the establishment to ensure that the trash was disposed of and area was free of debris after the event finished. Upon arrival to the location on August 6, 2019, Inspector Tudhope observed that trash cans located at the establishment were full and trash was littered throughout the parking lot of the establishment. 10. **Eric Losin and Karen Patten, Kali’s Court, LLC, T/a Kali’s Court, 1602-08 Thames Street – Class “BD7” Beer, Wine & Liquor License – Violation of Rule 4.16 Illegal Conduct – July 27, 2019** – At approximately 10:50 PM, Agent Andy Perez of the BLLC was conducting routine inspections of licensed establishments along Thames Street, when he responded to this establishment. Upon his arrival, Agent Perez observed a full-service outdoor bar operating and serving alcoholic beverages in front courtyard of the establishment. Agent Perez also observed several tables placed on the sidewalk in front of the location, which were placed there by the establishment for use by patrons to consume alcoholic beverages. After reviewing the Use and Occupancy Permit issued to the establishment and ruling by the Board of Municipal Zoning Appeals (BMZ2017-70), the BLLC determined that the establishment was in violation as City code had prohibited them from erecting a full service outdoor bar in their courtyard area and allowing for outdoor table service on the sidewalk.
